SUNDAY'S CHARGERS-PATRIOTS PLAYOFF GAME AT QUALCOMM STADIUM DECLARED 'OVERFLOW CAPACITY EVENT'

*All fans will be required to have a valid game ticket to
enter the stadium parking facility*

The City of San Diego, in accordance with Section 59.0104 (e) of the Municipal Code, has declared the game on Sunday, January 14, at Qualcomm Stadium between the Chargers and New England Patriots to be an "Overflow Capacity Event." All fans will be required to have a valid game ticket to enter the stadium parking facility.

"Only ticket holders will be allowed onto Qualcomm Stadium property," said Erik Stover, Qualcomm Stadium manager. "This is an exciting time for the City and one of our top priorities is to make sure that the parking lot is safe and accessible."

The Municipal Code's provision for the declaration of an overflow capacity event is intended to enhance security procedures and to assist in the safe ingress and egress of vehicles at the stadium.

"This game is truly a special occasion for the city and our fans," said Jim Steeg, Chargers executive vice president and chief operating officer. "We hope everyone attending the game will give themselves plenty of time to get to the stadium and soak up every minute of excitement surrounding the game."
