Hello again, My name is Pamela Hendrickson. I'm the Recording Secretary for the National Council of Negro Woman San Diego, The VP & Tail-twister for the Presidents Lions Club. As you know, I live in Lemon Grove but I'm very concerned about keeping District 4 the "Heart and Soul" of the African-American Community.

I thought the meeting last night was informative and helpful to everyone. Thank you for doing these types of meeting. I know it was helpful to me and I took lots of notes last night. And I really took to heart what the lawyer said about not creating district were race is the sole motivation.

It's important to know, that to me and other African-Americans we're very sensitive to voting and political representative for obvious reasons. It's very important that African-Americans not be disenfranchised and excluded from representatives. I won't rehash the past but my community won't stand for that.

I listened to what community member, the commissioners and lawyer said last night and reread the handout, stay up late re-working my maps last night.

I think I came up with a WIN-WIN for everyone. As I said last night EVERY community is going to have to come to the table and give a little. So I didn't use race as sole reason when I reworked my maps.

I used the freeway and major streets to divide communities, because frankly, that was the easiest way to do it. And these districts are also compact, like you said they should be.

I created 2- 2 ½ districts were Latino's were representative and mixed race district. After all, we are all Americans with rich heritages to be proud of.

District 8 remains about the same and Latinos are well represented in that district. I think they will be happy with it.

District Four retains the historical nature of what it has always been. It's a balanced district between African-Americans, Latinos and Asians.

The NEW Ninth District should be a district were Latinos again will be represented. It's a City Heights center district. Which I think is a good thing because, as I read in the UT today, 10 years ago City Heights was craved up. So it's fitting that with the growing Latino population that the new district be a Latino District. It's my understanding that Latinos are almost 1/3 of the residents of San Diego and they MUST be represented.






