

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Redistricting Goals


- Adhere to San Diego City Charter Section 5.1
- Create/Draw nine (9) uniform council districts within the City of San Diego
- Utilize 2010 Census Data
- Utilize the Online Redistricting Tool provided on Commission’s website (<https://sd-redistricting.esri.com/districting/districting.html>)
- Get as close to the Redistricting Commission’s goal of 144,624
- Ensure as little deviation as possible
- Need cohesive and contiguous communities
- Be mindful of diversity of council districts throughout the city
- Be fair, honest, and non-partisan
- Number the districts concurrent with today’s district numbers

Redistricting Objectives

- Create two (2) Latino community-interest districts
- Create one (1) Asian/Pacific Islander community-interest district
- Create one (1) African-American community-interest district
- Create one (1) Coastal/Beach community-interest district
- Create one (1) LGBT community-interest district
- Overall district deviation city-wide of less than 8%



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Central, Council District 3 Map (Proposal)





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South of 94, Council District 4 Map (Proposal)





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Mission Trails, Council District 5 Map (Proposal)





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Clairemont, Council District 6 Map (Proposal)








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Barrio Logan/South Bay, Council District 8 Map (Proposal)





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UCSD/Mira Mesa, Council District 9 Map (Proposal)





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Facts & Stats:

- Proposed Council District 1: Largest over-deviation in proposal (+ 0.70 %)
- Proposed Council District 6: Largest under-deviation in proposal (- 0.72 %)
- Total deviation: 1.42% (*reaches goal of less than 8%*)
- District 2 is drawn in interest of Coastal/Beach Communities
- District 3 is drawn in interest of LGBT empowerment, proposed area had strongest opposition to Prop. 8 than anywhere else in San Diego.
- District 4 is drawn in interest of African-American empowerment, 20.26% of residents are of African-American background
- Districts 7 and 8 are drawn in interest of Latino empowerment, 47.23% of District 7 residents are Latino, 74.27% of District 8 residents are Latino
- District 9 is drawn in interest of Asian/Pacific Islander empowerment, 39.41% residents are of Asian/Pacific Islander background
