Lose the Roaditude - - - - - -

Lose the Roaditude is a safety awareness campaign targeting bicyclists, motorists and pedestrians. This campaign is made possible by the City of San Diego in partnership with the San Diego Association of Governments (SANDAG).

The Campaign -----

The Lose the Roaditude campaign is aimed at increasing the awareness of common rules and curbing aggressive behavior on the road between bicyclists, motorists and pedestrians. We consider people's willingness to ignore the rules of the road, act aggressive or negligent as "Roaditude."

This campaign encourages people to "Lose the Roaditude" through a positive series of messages promoting safety and respect on the road, such as:

- Crossing at crosswalks
- Yielding to pedestrians crossing at intersections
- Stopping at stop signs and signals
- Bicycling with the flow of traffic
- Sharing the road when no bike lane is present

The Strategy - - - - - -

Lose the Roaditude is primarily a public information campaign. Media advertising is a component of the campaign, encompassing billboards, bus panels, transit shelters, circulars, the City TV 24 message board and the website.

Success of this campaign will result in bicyclists, motorists and pedestrians thinking about how they act on the road and modifying their behaviors. Our true goal is to foster the adoption of new attitudes that will make our streets safer for everyone who uses them. The ultimate benefit could be a reduction in injuries, crashes and fatalities caused by non-compliance with traffic laws and rules.
