

## The City of San Diego Water Conservation Program

was established to reduce the City's dependency on imported water. Today, the Water Conservation Program directly accounts for more than 34,000 acre-feet of water savings per year. These savings have been achieved by creating a water conservation ethic; adopting programs, policies and ordinances designed to promote water conservation practices; and, implementing comprehensive public information and education campaigns.

### Waste No Water

Our City's water supplies are currently in crisis. In 2010, there were unprecedented challenges facing our water system including the prolonged and continuing drought conditions across the west and mounting legal restrictions on deliveries of imported water for our region. The poster theme, Waste No Water, reflects the importance of taking care of this precious resource and to use water wisely at all times.

### Why Is Water Conservation Important?

In 2009, the City of San Diego declared a Level 2 Water Emergency where San Diegans were subject to mandatory water use restrictions. San Diegans have done a great job to conserve water and we want to continue supporting our customers to integrate this water ethic as part of our long-term lifestyle. Use this calendar to learn about tips and programs that will help you conserve water throughout this new year.

### How Does It Work?

The Water Conservation Program reduces water demand through promoting and offering incentives for the installation of hardware that provides permanent water savings, and by providing free services and information to help San Diegans make better decisions about water use. ## Free Water Conservation Programs and Services for San Diego Residents

### Residential Water Survey Program

This Citywide program is offered free of charge to single-family and multi-family water customers who pay their water bills to the City of San Diego. As part of this program, a Water Conservation Representative will tour your property to identify leaks and water-saving opportunities. Participants can receive water-saving equipment and information, including low-flow showerheads, faucet aerators and other free items. The Representative will also evaluate your landscape and irrigation systems. Since this program emphasizes customer education, it is important the tenant/occupant be present at the time of the survey. ### Residential Outdoor Water Conservation Rebates & Services

A water-efficient landscape and irrigation system can reduce outdoor water use and minimize the amount of polluted dry weather runoff that enters the storm drain system. The City of San Diego is working to assist customers to conserve water by offering rebates for smart controllers, micro-irrigation, and turf replacement. Public Utilities customers residing in a single-family home, duplex, townhome, or condominium that is served by an individual water meter can participate in any or all three rebate categories. Rebates are offered through a State of California grant and are available on a first come, first served basis until funding is exhausted. ### 20-Gallon Challenge

Increases voluntary water conservation by 20 gallons per person, per day through a region-wide campaign called the 20-Gallon Challenge. ### Water Conservation Action Committee

Increases water conservation efforts among the residents of multi-family homes. The committee evaluates the usefulness of available programs, provides suggestions, and promotes the programs within the industries they represent.

### Water Conservation Garden on the Campus of Cuyamaca College

Serves as a learning resource center with beautiful, healthy gardens. It includes an amphitheater, multiple educational exhibits, more than 360 trees, and 100,000 square feet of water-efficient landscaping well suited to San Diego's climate. ### Commercial Landscape Survey Program

The Commercial Landscape Survey Program is provided free of charge to commercial, industrial and institutional customers in the City of San Diego. Qualifying properties must have more than one acre of landscaped property. By getting involved in this program, properties will receive an audit of the irrigation system, practical advice, water-saving recommendations and a water-use budget. Many properties can expect water savings of between 20 and 40 percent. Skilled surveyors will review the water-use history of the property to determine where water savings are possible. Participants will also receive a written evaluation of the irrigation system's performance, aerial photos of the property, a water-use estimate for the upcoming year and an irrigation controller schedule for each month. ### Community and Corporate Partnerships

Expands available resources and looks at innovative ways to carry the water conservation message. ### Water Waste Hotline


