## San Diego Public Utilities Department Honored with Outreach Award AWWA recognizes water purification communications excellence

SAN DIEGO – The American Water Works Association (AWWA) has awarded the City of San Diego with the 2014 Public Communications Achievement Award. The City received the award for representing excellence and achievement in the field of public affairs for its Water Purification Demonstration Project's public outreach program. The City will receive the award during the Opening General Session at AWWA's 2014 Annual Conference & Exposition (ACE14) on June 9 in Boston.

The City's Demonstration Project explored and confirmed the feasibility of purifying recycled water for use in

supplementing local drinking water supplies. The outreach program included presentations, booths at community events, facility tours, informational materials, advertisements and social media. The City Council unanimously adopted the project's findings in April 2013 and set forth directives for implementing water purification in San Diego.

AWWA's Public Communications Achievement Award recognizes AWWA members and/or organizations for significant accomplishments in communication-educating the public, promoting awareness and understanding of water issues, establishing media relations, implementing community involvement programs, and inspiring others to model behavior with the public that builds trust and credibility.



The City's water purification public outreach program has served as a model to other agencies seeking to implement water purification. Water agencies from as far away as Australia have visited to learn more about how to best communicate about water purification to the public.

The City of San Diego has limited local water supplies and must import an average of 85 percent of its drinking water supply. The Water Purification Demonstration Project determined that purified water can safely augment San Diego's drinking water supply following advanced water treatment. The San Diego City Council unanimously adopted the report findings in April 2013. Preliminary tasks for implementing water purification are currently underway. If implemented, water purification would have the benefit of supplementing San Diego's limited local water supply and reducing its dependence on imported water.
