3/25 City Council Meeting

City Council will meet at 10 a.m. on 3/25 to vote on two items: the proposed residential and commercial eviction moratorium due to COVID-19 and the establishment of a small business relief fund (SBRF) to support small businesses in their ability to sustain operations and retain employees following COVID-19.
