SDPD Northeastern Welcomes New Captain

I'm pleased to announce that Acting Captain Lieutenant Sandra Rapalee-Albrektsen, has been officially promoted to Captain of SDPD Northeastern Division, which serves most of District Five. She replaces retiring Captain Dawn Summers, a 30 year veteran of the department.

Albrektsen has held a variety of jobs during her 30-years in law enforcement including patrol officer, detective, sergeant, lieutenant and acting captain. She served as a Community Relations Officer, Field Training Sergeant, and Field Training Administrator: coaching and training officers and new police recruits. As a detective, she worked in Child Abuse, Sex Crimes, Internal Affairs, and the Vice Unit dealing with police regulated businesses. As a Lieutenant, she was in charge of the Internet Crimes against Children and Sex Registrants. Captain Albrektsen is a police academy instructor in Racial Profiling, EEO, Problem Solving and Active Shooter. Captain Albrektsen is also a FEMA Instructor for Cal State Long Beach and has been a college professor for over 25 years.



Captain Albrektsen has a master of public administration and a bachelor of science in criminal justice, both from San Diego State University. She is currently pursuing a Doctorate in Education from USD.

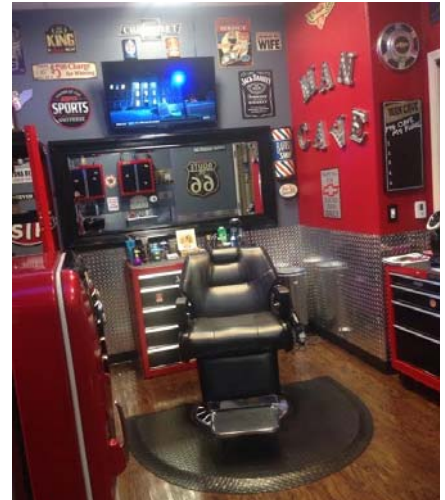

Scripps Ranch Storm Drain Replaced



I am happy to report that we finally succeeded in getting the damaged storm drain on Rue Chantemar in Scripps Ranch replaced. The work on the storm drain will be completed this month. Additional measures are also being made to protect the slopes until revegetation occurs. I want to thank the homeowners in the area for continuing to speak up on this issue and their patience.

It will be critical that we maintain this and other newly repaired storm drains so I will continue to press for maintenance funding to be included in the budget. If my Rebuild San Diego proposal is approved by voters, we will have a dedicated funding stream for this and other infrastructure projects for the next 25 years.
