Ensuring our Schools are Safe



Many of the schools in District Five are located within the Poway Unified School District. In response to recent incidents involving threats toward students and/or schools, PUSD has partnered with the San Diego Police Department and the County Sheriff's Department to establish a tip line covering all 40 PUSD schools. Messages left on the toll-free hotline 844-PUSD-TIP (844-787-3847) are monitored around the clock by law enforcement.

San Diego Unified School District reports making more

than \$40 million in school safety upgrades since 2012 and that all SDUSD schools now have comprehensive school safety plans.

Regardless of jurisdiction, it is critical for public agencies to work together to ensure our schools and families are safe, and I have committed my full support to these efforts and SDPD's role.

New Captain at SDPD Northeastern Division



I'm proud to welcome Captain Christopher Knighten as Commanding Officer of SDPD Northeastern Division. Captain Knighten started his career in law enforcement with the City of Carlsbad, where he worked for five years prior to joining America's Finest in 1996. He's worked a variety of assignments such as Internal Affairs, Watch Commander/Field Lieutenant, and in Traffic Division as a Motorcycle Officer. He takes over for Captain Stephanie Rose, who moved into another unit.

In our recent meeting, we discussed the Captain's priorities for school safety and how he directly monitors any tips through the PUSD tip line. We also discussed other neighborhood safety programs in District Five, including the Retired Senior Volunteer

Patrol (RSVP) and Neighborhood Watch. The Division still has a few Scripps Ranch Neighborhood Watch signs, funded by my office's City Programs, Projects and Services (CPPS) grant, so if you're interested in having one in your neighborhood, please email my office at <u>MarkKersey@sandiego.gov</u>. 


