# Federal News

## **Travel Effects**

The President has issued Border closures to nonessential travelers from Canada and Mexico. Additionally, the State Department has implemented a Level 4 travel advisory warning Americans against traveling abroad, meaning all international travel from the US should be avoided and US residents should return back to the US.

New rules are being developed at ports of entry to prevent non-essential travel, will not impede commerce and trade.

## Tax Day now July 15

Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin announced that Tax Day would be moved to July 15, giving Americans an additional three months to file their income tax returns.

The Department of Education will not enforce standardized testing this school year. Also, all interest on federally held student loans have been temporarily suspended and federal lenders are allowed to suspend payments for the next 60 days.

## Governor Newsom Issues "Stay at Home" Order

Last night, Governor Newsom announced a statewide order for all people to stay at home. This order restricts non-essential movement, but still allows for Californians to carry on essential activities such as grocery shopping, picking up prescriptions, visiting laundry services, and walking their dogs.

Further, any Californians working in the 16 critical infrastructure sectors, as defined by the Federal Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency <u>here</u>, may continue their work.

## County News

## March 20 Press Conference

Some key takeaways were:

- All businesses not deemed essential by the state MUST close. Employees of essential businesses aren't included in the county's 10-person rule but must practice social distancing.
- 80 percent of COVID-19 cases are mild and can be ridden out at home. Those folks should isolate at home until three days have passed with no fever without medication and at least seven days since the onset of symptoms.
- The County has opened SDCCU Stadium for drive-up testing. This is only for patients who get referred by a physician.

Per the 3/20 county conference, at least 1,049 tests have been done.

As of 4 p.m. 3/20:

- Total Cases in San Diego County: 105
  - 10-19 years: 1 case
  - 20-29 years: 20 cases

- 30-39 years: 24 cases
- 40-49 years: 22 cases
- 50-59 years: 13 cases
- 60-69 years: 4 cases
- 70-79 years: 15 cases
- 80+ years: 6 cases
- Hospitalized Cases: 13

- A telehealth protocol for community-based programs to continue to provide mental health services safely.
- The residential treatment program with no visitors allowed. We have activated the protocol we developed in preparation for this pandemic to have the appropriate staffing and provide the necessary level of care.
