## Historic Infrastructure Investment in New Budget

The proposed fiscal year 2017 budget invests more than \$350 million to infrastructure improvements, including a record \$109 million for street repairs. The budget also proposes extended recreation center and library hours, and creating a 3-1-1 system to improve customer service. - \$109 million in street repair funding
- Most funding for the Capital Improvements Program this decade
- Expanding recreation center hours
- Four academies for police recruits and two for firefighter recruits
- Expansions to popular afterschool and youth jobs programs
- Tripling the amount of major storm channel clearings
- Millions for new and replacement sidewalks and streetlights
- Funding to move forward on innovative Pure Water program
- Creating a 3-1-1-style system to improve customer service
- Resources to begin implementing Climate Action Plan (see below)
- Park and playground improvements throughout the city

## **Climate Action Plan Implementation**

Last year, City Council approved a Climate Action Plan that will benefit San Diego's environment and economy. In the proposed fiscal year 2017 budget, there is nearly \$130 million supporting the goals of the plan. Highlights of the new funding include:

- Installing 50 miles of new or improved bicycle lanes and implementing the Bike Master Plan
- Installing approximately six megawatts of solar panels on City facilities
- Constructing new and improved sidewalks
- Purchasing 20 new compressed natural gas trash and recycle trucks that will run on landfill gas
- Planting 2,000 trees, and maintaining and preserving existing trees
- Installing and modifying traffic signal systems to reduce congestion
- Installing new energy efficiency and "smart" streetlights
