- SUBJECT: Reallocation of Mission Bay Park Improvement Funds to Various Projects

## <u>SUMMARY</u>

<u>Issue</u> – Currently, there are five Mission Bay Park Improvement Fund projects that are in need of funds for either the design or construction process. Should the Mission Bay Park Improvement Fund Oversight Committee approve the reallocation of funds as outlined in this report?

<u>Director's Recommendation</u> – Approve the recommended transfers of funds as outlined in this report.

<u>Fiscal Impact</u> – This allocation of Mission Bay Park Improvement Funds will allow for each project to continue in their current phase. Projects lending funds will see no impact to their current stage.

<u>Water and Energy Conservation Status</u> – Not applicable.

<u>Environmental</u> – The transfer of funds will not result in any direct or reasonably foreseeable indirect physical changes in the environment and is therefore not subject to CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c)(2).

# BACKGROUND:

The Mission Bay Park Improvement Fund (MBPIF) is one of two capital improvement project funds to receive Mission Bay Park lease revenues from leaseholds in Mission Bay Park. The other fund is the San Diego Regional Park Improvement Fund (RPIF). The two funds were established by voter approval of revisions to the City Charter, Article V, Section 55.2 and became effective July 1, 2009, with the start of Fiscal Year 2010.

Per the City Charter, the first \$20 million in Mission Bay leasehold revenues is allocated toward general government purposes. The next \$10 million in leasehold revenues is split between MBPIF and RPIF, with RPIF receiving the

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first \$3.5 million and MBPIF receiving the next \$6.5 million. For any leasehold revenues received in excess of \$30 million, the allocation is split at a ratio of 65% for MBPIF and 35% for RPIF.

The City believes in effective cash management when it comes to its Capital Improvements Program (CIP). One cash management practice the Parks and Recreation Department employs to ensure timely completion of projects requires the periodic requests to reallocate funds from projects not yet ready for construction to priority projects that are closer to their next phase.

DISCUSSION
