#### Call to Order

Mr. Peter Dennehy called the meeting to order at 9:04 a.m. with 5 board members present, with one member arriving late. Quorum was achieved at the same time.

#### Approval of Minutes

Mr. Dennehy called for a motion to approve the December 12<sup>th</sup>, 2019 meeting minutes. Ms. Sarah Berns moved to approve the minutes. Mr. Zaheen Chowdhury seconded the motion. The minutes were then approved unanimously, 6-0.

Board Announcements
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• Mr. Rich Thesing asked whether City Staff will present on the Housing Navigation Center. Ms. Michele Marano responded that a presentation date has not yet been



confirmed. Ms. Marano recommended that ad-hoc committee discussions begin and if CPAB members want to make written recommendation to the Mayor's Office or City Council, staff may include their written recommendation in the allocation and approval item for the FY 2021 Annual Action Plan.

#### Staff Announcements

- Ms. Marano announced that the <u>Nonprofit Academy Workshop Series</u> launched on January 16<sup>th</sup>. These workshops help non-profit organizations improve their capacity. Registration is available online and workshops take place from February to April.
- Ms. Marano stated that the <u>Analysis of Impediments to Fair Housing choice survey</u> deadline has been extended to February 14<sup>th</sup>. There have been 680 responses regionally so far.
- Ms. Marano announced a free training for housing consumers in the City of San Diego on Saturday, February 15<sup>th</sup> at the City Heights Library. The training will be hosted by the Legal Aid Society.
- Mr. Leonardo Alarcon introduced the newest staff member to the Community Development Division, Nadine Hassoun. Ms. Hassoun will be working with the CPAB and other policy related projects.

Mr. Thesing motioned to approve this item, which was seconded by Mr. Dennehy. The motion was approved unanimously, 6-0.



Mid-City IDEA Lab (design) \$2,000,000

To fund the design phase of a pending Library Department CIP. Preliminary scope includes a 12,000 square foot, 3-story IDEA Lab which will feature state-of-the-art technology, classroom spaces, a small library collection and staff areas.

City Heights Pool CIP \$2,066,980.31

To fund the construction of a new pool and decking, upgrades to mechanical and electrical equipment, installation of a new slide and children's pool play structure, ADA upgrades to restrooms and locker rooms, outdoor showers and the path of travel.

<u>Catholic Charities</u> \$287,500 To complete improvements to the Rachel's Women Center. Improvements will include replacement of cabinets and windows, replacement of a wheelchair lift, plumbing and HVAC repair and replacements, electrical wiring and painting.

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
