ITEM #1 Call to Order/Roll Call: Chair Robin Kaufman called the meeting to order at 7 p.m. A quorum was met with 10 out of 14 members present.

ITEM #2 <u>Chair remarks:</u> Chair Robin Kaufman welcomed everyone and reminded attendees that while this is a zoom meeting, we follow the same protocol as if we were meeting in person. She also took time to recognize and express gratitude to the two members who will be stepping down – Terry Norwood and Mark Huettinger.

ITEM #3 Non-agenda public comment (3 minutes per speaker):

-Becky Rapp had comments pertaining to marijuana outlets, commenting that the County recently passed an ordinance allowing them to have lounge areas. -Kathleen Lippit commented on lack of enforcement of Proposition 64 which does not allow billboards to promote products that can entice minors or business promotions. She commented that training of officers is required to enforce this proposition, but has yet to transpire. She also gave the following telephone number to call when someone sees a billboard with such promotions: 1-833-WEEDTIP (9333847).

ITEM #4 Government Staff Reports:

-Eric Young, II, representing Councilwoman von Wilpert's office informed us that the Councilwoman is Co-chair of the Covid Response committee. He also informed us there is state funding available for rent relief. He updated us on two matters he assisted with in the community – a damaged fence between residential property and City property (the City will be replacing it at no cost to the residents), and a long-time, damaged security fence at the community park that he assisted in finally getting fixed. Finally, he encouraged people to utilize the Get It Done app.

-The Board reviewed the insurance policies due in April. It was agreed to have the executive board review more details and make the final decision of renewing it prior to the deadline.

- The Board approved the final details for the pizza fun run to take place this summer.

- The Board approved to recognize volunteers of all ages, during national volunteer week (April 18-24). Anyone can nominate an individual who resides in RB by completed the application and submitting a photo by April 16. That information, along with the photo, will be posted on the RB Community Council's Facebook page during national volunteer week.
