

### **Adopted In 1992**


### **Overall Community Goals:**

### Rapid Job Growth

### Between 2010 to 2015:

- Mira Mesa grew faster than City & County average
- Jobs in Mira Mesa grew 6.6 times faster than housing




### **Unaffordable Housing Crisis**

### Between 1970 to 2018:

- Median Income grew
  4.8 percent per year;
- While housing price grew 12.3 percent per year

In 1970 housing cost 2.3 times the median income

In 2018 housing cost 6.4 times the median income


## Median Asking Rent in Mira Mesa (8/2018)\*:

- One bedroom \$1,782
- Two bedroom \$2,177

## Median Asking Rent in San Diego (7/2018)\*\*:

- One bedroom \$1,850

### **Future Growth Forecast**


SANDAG forecast suggests by 2050 Mira Mesa will add additional:

- 10,042 jobs




## **Future Demographic Trend**


- A society growing younger and older (pie chart)
- Lower birth rate and smaller family size\*
- Majority of the CA population growth expected to come from natural increase\*\*



Roughly 75% of US population growth from 2010 to 2030 will be people younger than 35 and older than 65 and consist of singles and couples rather than families with kids.












### Planning Department – Worker Commute

- Employment areas in Mira Mesa is a regional attractor
- Workers commute from all over the region
- About 10 percent (8,319) of employees commute from three ZIP Codes immediately north of planning area (92130, 92129, 92127)






### Planning Department – Worker Commute & Traffic

- Out of 34,737 workers living in Mira Mesa, about 21.1 percent lived and worked in Mira Mesa; while 78.6 percent worked outside the community
- 75,610 workers commute into Mira Mesa everyday


### Mira Mesa Workers Inflow/Outflow Analysis


