## CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT - Councilmember Campillo

• During the recent budget process, I advocated for funding for the Old Mission Dam Dredging project. As a result, \$750,000.00 is allocated in the budget for the project.

302. Mission Trails Flow Regulatory Structure II Construction and Vernal Pool Habitat Site Restoration Transfer – San Diego County Water Authority Staff Aaron Trimm, Summer Adleberg, Rachel Kulis

- The project is nearing completion. There will be a pipeline shutdown in June to make the final connections. Then the existing vent structures will be removed followed by the removal of the laydown yard. It is anticipated that the construction crews will be out of the park by Fall.
- Temporary irrigation is currently being installed that will be followed by native plant installation and hydroseeding. There will be a 120-day plant establishment period and then a 5-year maintenance and monitoring period.
- It was determined that 0.04 acres of vernal pool habitat was impacted by the San Diego County Water Authority. As mitigation, the Water Authority has created a 1.65-acre site that includes 26 vernal pools. The success criteria were met in 2018 and there is a long-term maintenance and management plan in place. Next steps include transferring the property to the City of San Diego along with an endowment fund for the continued maintenance of the site. The transfer will go to the City Council for final approval and sign off.
- Water authority is planning on removing the temporary trail closures in August.

## MTRP FOUNDATION REPORT - Jennifer Morrissey, Executive Director, MTRPF

• Thank you to Councilmember Campillo for advocating for the Old Mission Dam project and for funding for wildlife cameras for the park. The annual photo contest is going on and there will be an award ceremony on June 5<sup>th</sup>. In partnership with the San Diego Unified School District, the Foundation has received a grant to host a summer camp. The camp will accommodate up to 90 students per week and the Foundation is currently in the process of hiring staff for the program. The Foundation is currently applying for grant money to purchase additional property for the park. The Foundation has contracted with a company to produce a comprehensive assessment of the Visitor Center.

## MTRP Senior Ranger Report-Ryan Robertson

- Ranger Medina-Bandy has accepted a position as a Park Ranger with the County of San Diego leaving Mission Trails with a vacancy. We will be working on filling the vacancy as soon as possible.
- We have been experiencing major issues with our online campground reservation system
  that is a contracted-out service. We had to shut down the system for almost two weeks.
  The system is now back up and running. Staff did an amazing job handling the situation
  which included being available to take in-person reservations for extended hours and
  spending an immense amount of time with our IT staff, and representatives from the
  contracted company.

# Open Space Division Staff Report- Erika Ferreira

- Thank you to Councilmember Campillo for advocating for Old Mission Dam Funding. We have already reached out to the previous project officers to start working on the needed permits as soon as possible.
- District Manager interviews will be conducted in June. We are hopeful that we will have a new Open Space District Manager on board prior to the next Task Force meeting.
