

CONSTRUCTION NOTICE:

Pipeline Work Scheduled on Executive Drive for Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels

July 7, 2022

On July 11, 2022, the installation of concrete k-rail barriers will begin to prepare for pipeline construction for the Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels project in University City. On Executive Drive, from the Executive Drive cul de sac near I-805 to Towne Centre Drive, crews will install permanent k-rail barriers from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. This work is expected to last one night only. The barriers will safely separate moving traffic from pipeline construction on Executive Drive and will allow one lane to remain open to traffic adjacent to the active work zone.

To minimize nighttime noise impacts, pipeline installation is then scheduled to begin during the day on Wednesday, July 13 from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on Towne Centre Drive and Executive Drive to the cul-de-sac. Pipeline work is expected to be ongoing from Mondays to Fridays and continue for several months.

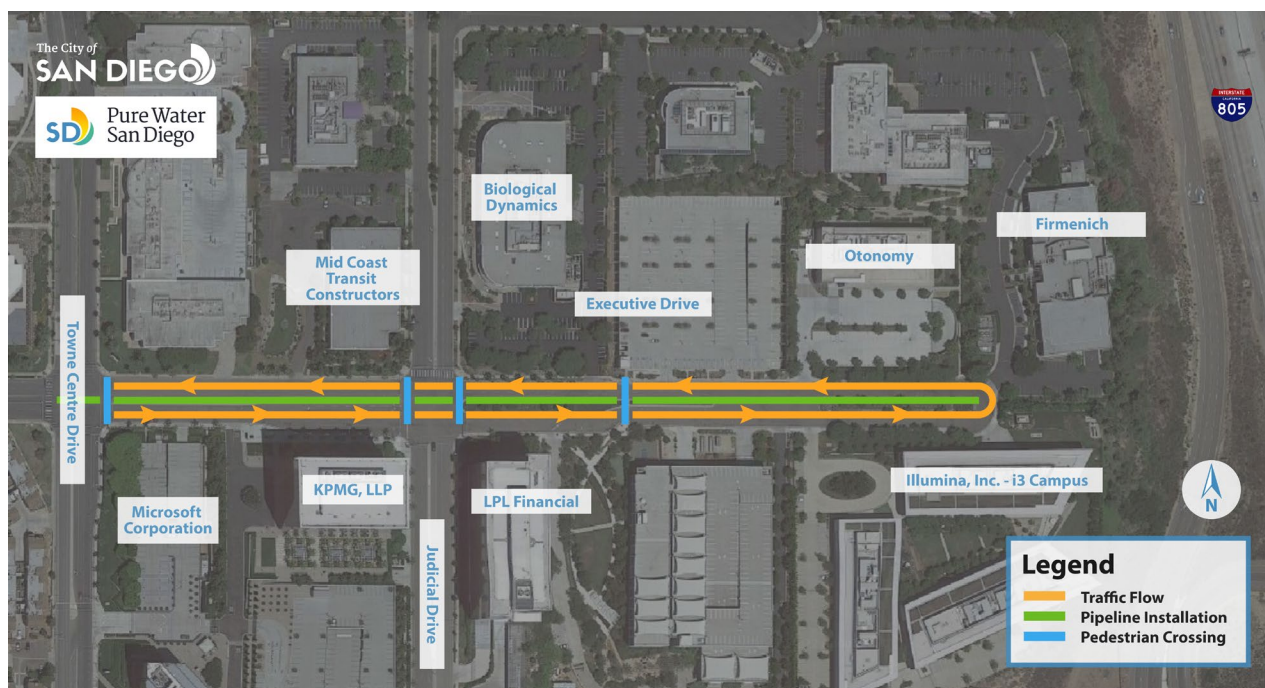
There will also be a temporary closure of the westbound lanes on Executive Drive at the intersection of Judicial Drive for approximately one week, from July 11, 2022 to July 18, 2022, so that crews can install beam and lagging shoring. There will be a detour and signage posted to direct traffic around the closure. This detour will be removed after this installation has been completed.

What to Expect:

- Installation of barriers and traffic control on Executive Drive from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- The installation of the barriers will include construction noise.
- Pipeline installation on Executive Drive to Towne Centre Drive during the day from 7 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; this work will include construction noise.
- 24/7 access to driveways for businesses and residences.
- Businesses on Executive Drive are being asked to contact sbowles@sandiego.gov to coordinate any deliveries that involve trucks or large vehicles or access issues.
- For safety reasons, please follow all posted traffic signage.
- Pedestrian crossings will remain open.

Why: Pure Water San Diego is the City of San Diego's phased, multi-year program that will provide nearly half of San Diego's water supply locally by 2035. The Pure Water San Diego Program will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water. The Program offers a cost-effective investment for San Diego's water needs and will provide a reliable, sustainable water supply. The Morena Northern Pipelines and Tunnels project is one of several major water infrastructure projects in Phase 1 of Pure Water San Diego.

Pipeline Installation along Genesee Avenue, Nobel Drive and Towne Centre Drive: More information will be provided in the coming months for pipeline construction along the rest of the alignment. The pipeline construction schedule is being solidified and ample notice will be given prior to pipeline construction.
