

**CONSTRUCTION NOTICE: Parking Removal and Nighttime Lane Impacts on Sherman Street  
between Morena Boulevard and Custer Street**

August 19, 2022

From Sunday, August 21 through Thursday, September 29, parking removals and nighttime temporary lane reductions will be in effect on Sherman Street from Morena Boulevard to Custer Street as crews relocate sewer lines. This work is for the City of San Diego Morena Pump Station project, part of the Pure Water San Diego Program.

Work hours and lane closures are scheduled Sunday through Thursday, 9 p.m. to 5 a.m. One lane will remain open at all times and driveways will remain accessible to businesses. Flaggers will be in place to direct traffic and pedestrians around the work area.

**What To Expect:** Construction crews will conduct underground utility investigations and relocate sewer lines on Sherman Street by trenching, installing new pipeline and sewer manholes, soil backfilling, and restoring the roadway. **Temporary 24-hour parking removals and nighttime lane reductions will be in place. Construction crews will maintain access to driveways and one lane of traffic will remain open at all times.** All nearby businesses will remain open and accessible. Please follow all posted signage and crew member directions near the work zone and expect delays in the area.

**When:** Sherman Street between Morena Boulevard and Custer Street will have 24-hour parking removals and nighttime lane reductions in place from Sunday, August 21, 2022 to Thursday, September 29, 2022. The work on Sherman Street is scheduled for Sunday to Thursday nights, from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.

**Why:** Pure Water San Diego is the City of San Diego's phased, multi-year program that will provide nearly half of San Diego's water supply locally by 2035. The Pure Water Program will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water. The Program offers a cost-effective investment for San Diego's water needs and will provide a reliable, sustainable water supply. The Morena Pump Station project is one of several major water infrastructure projects that are part of Phase 1 of Pure Water San Diego.

The City is committed to clear communication and providing up-to-date information about construction activities. Properties along the construction area will receive printed notices before work begins near their address, and construction notices will be regularly posted on [morena.purewatersd.org](https://morena.purewatersd.org).
