Police Investigate Suspicious Death in City Heights

San Diego – This afternoon, at approximately 4:45 p.m., the San Diego Police Communications Center received a call from a concerned citizen requesting a welfare check of a male in an apartment in the 4200 block of Euclid Avenue. The male had not been seen for some time and when an acquaintance checked on the male, they saw what appeared to be an injured person in the male’s apartment. Officers from Mid-City Division responded and arrived within minutes. Upon arriving, the officers forced entry into the male’s apartment after confirming seeing what appeared to be a seriously injured or deceased male on the floor in the apartment. Once inside, the officers located an obviously deceased male suffering from trauma to his upper body.

Due to the suspicious nature surrounding the death of the male, San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene to investigate.

The deceased male has been identified; however, his name is not being released at this time pending family notifications. He is described as a 52-year-old Hispanic or white male. The exact cause of his death is pending examination by the San Diego County Medical Examiner Office.
