Update on Mira Mesa Murder; Suspect Identified

San Diego – On Friday, April 22, 2022, just before 3:00 p.m., the San Diego Police Communications Center received a call of stabbing in the area of 8600 Pagoda Way. Officers from Northeastern Division responded and located two females, a mother and daughter, who had been stabbed at their residence.

The first victim is described as an 87-year-old white female. She was pronounced dead at the scene. She is now identified as Peggy Brandenburgh.

The second victim is described as a 60-year-old white female (originally her age was reported as 59-years-old). She was transported by medics to a local hospital and treated. She is expected to survive her injuries. Her name will not be released at this time.

San Diego Police Homicide Detectives were called to the scene. Initial information indicates that the suspect entered the residence and immediately stabbed both victims. The evidence shows the suspect was familiar with the residence and this was not a random attack, although the motivation is still being determined.

The investigation to this point has revealed that the suspect is Anthony Dwayne Siddle, described as a 59-year-old white male, 6'03, 165 lbs, with gray hair and glasses, last seen in a maroon shirt and blue jeans. See photo below.

Siddle is believed to have left the area in a dark gray 2018 Ford Ecosport with Montana license plate 103478E, possibly headed for Mexico. Siddle should be considered armed and dangerous and should not be approached. Please call 9-1-1 if he is seen. Detectives have obtained an arrest warrant for Siddle.
