Myrtle's Message | Access to Quality

Whether I'm advocating for access to quality food, quality retail, quality jobs, or quality affordable housing, I want us to have **"access to quality"** in the Fourth Council District. This week at City Council, my Council colleagues and I voted (7-1) to address the issue of quality affordable housing in the true spirit of **collaborative government**. We understand that something needed to be done to **address the shortage of quality affordable housing** and at the same time we were sensitive to business development.

The Workforce Housing Offset (formerly called Linkage Fee) is a one-time payment made by developers. As commercial development increases, so does the demand for affordable housing for minimum wage and low-wage workers employed in these new buildings and developments. The Workforce Housing Offset ensures that commercial developers pay their fair share and don't leave cities and residents holding the bill for the impacts they have on the City's housing needs.

Revenues generated by the Workforce Housing Offset are channeled into the City of San Diego's Housing Trust Fund. Resources in the Housing Trust Fund are used to build homes that are affordable to low-wage workers and proximate to jobs. Every dollar spent from the Housing Trust Fund, San Diego sees \$30 come back in the form of outside and private investment. **Each new affordable unit created generates 2.1 jobs for San Diego's economy.** Until this compromise, **the Workforce Housing Offset had not been recommended to be adjusted since it was cut in half in 1996.**

My office sat down at the table with both sides and came up with a reasonable compromise that, based on historical data collection, is expected to **generate an additional \$3 million** over a fiveyear period above the current fees. There is still work to do but this is a good start. I thank my Council colleagues for supporting the hard work my office has done to reach this compromise. As Vice Chair of the Smart Growth and Land Use Committee, I'm working for our neighborhoods. Here are the highlights of the proposed updates to the Municipal Code that were approved by the City Council on Monday:

- Fee: Raise the fee 100%, phased-in over three years, to the 1990 level. Phase-in period begins on January 1, 2015.
- The Housing Impact Fee adjustment will not sunset.
- Exempt manufacturing, warehouse, and nonprofit hospitals from the Housing Impact Fee for the purposes of economic development.
- No adjustment to the fee levels for research and development construction, for the purpose of economic development.
- Remove requirement for annual recommendation to the Council for revenue level update based on a construction cost index.

Getting Things Done

- Tubman-Chavez Office Space Available for a 501 (c)(3) Organization: There are two offices available to lease at our Tubman-Chavez Community Center. For more information, please email Charmaine Gillis, Real Estate Assets Department, at <u>CGillis@sandiego.gov</u>.
- Mandatory Water Conservation: The Mayor is recommending the City of San Diego move to "Drought Alert" status, the second phase of citywide conservation that calls for mandatory measures for all residents and businesses. The new measures would go into effect Nov. 1, pending City Council approval. The City of San Diego has been a leader in water conservation, enacting permanent measures in 2011 that are more stringent than most cities and water districts throughout the state. City Council approved and the City entered into a "Drought Watch" status on July 1, 2014, which called for additional voluntary conservation measures in response to the statewide drought. Since then, water usage in San Diego fell 4.4 percent in August and 5.7 percent in September compared to the same month a year ago. By moving to "Drought Alert" status, the voluntary measures that have been in effect since July will become mandatory. It also calls for additional measures to be taken. - A new California law amended the Vehicle code to create safer roadways for bicyclists: Beginning October 16, 2014, when passing a cyclist on the road, drivers must give the cyclist a <u>buffer of no less than 3 feet</u> or slow to a reasonable speed if road or traffic conditions do not allow for the safety cushion of 3 feet.
- Neighborhood Revitalization with Code Enforcement: NOTICE OF ABATEMENT VACANT AND UNSECURED STRUCTURE issued: This notice was issued for a property on Greycourt Avenue that is in violation of the San Diego Municipal Code and California Health & Safety Code. The overall conditions of the site constitute a public nuisance and a threat to the public's health and safety. The property owner is required to secure the structure, remove debris and rubbish, and maintain a clean property at all times.

Queremos un Distrito 4 de Calidad

Trabajo contantemente para que tengamos acceso a oportunidades de calidad en el Distrito 4, ya sea a favor del acceso a alimentos de calidad, espacios comerciales de calidad, trabajos de calidad o vivienda a bajo costo. Esta semana en el Cabildo, mis colegas y yo en un espirito de colaboración votamos (7-1) a favor de avanzar en el tema de vivienda a bajo costo. Sabíamos que algo teníamos que hacer para detener la falta de vivienda a bajo costo y su vez incentivar el desarrollo comercial.

La tarifa de la mano de obra del sector vivienda es un pago único que realizan los desarrolladores. Conforme el desarrollo comercial incremente, también la demanda de vivienda a bajo costo incrementará para aquellas personas que ganan salarios mínimos y bajos. La tarifa asegurará que los desarrolladores paguen el precio justo por el impacto que sus desarrollos causen a la Ciudad.

Las ganancias generadas serán destinadas al Fondo de Vivienda de la Ciudad de San Diego. Los recursos del Fondo son utilizados para construir viviendas de calidad y a bajo costo. Por cada dólar invertido en el desarrollo de vivienda a bajo costo, la Ciudad de San Diego recibirá \$30 dólares en inversión privada. Por cada unidad de vivienda construida, se crearán 2.1 empleos en San Diego. Esta tarifa no había sido ajustada desde 1996.

Mi oficina se sentó a negociar con ambas partes para llegar a un compromiso basado en datos duros, lo cual generará más de \$3 millones de dólares adicionales en los próximos 5 años. Aún hay mucho trabajo por hacer, pero este es un buen inicio. Quiero agradecer a mis colegas del Cabido por apoyar este esfuerzo. Como Vice-presidenta del Comité de Desarrollo y Uso de Suelo, seguiré trabajando para nuestras comunidades. Estos son algunos de los cambios al Código Municipal aprobados por el Cabildo al Código Municipal.

- A partir del 1 de Enero del 2015 y durante los próximos tres años, la tarifa incrementará de a un 100%, hasta llegar al nivel de 1990.
- La tarifa no será transitoria
- Los desarrollos de manufactura, bodegas y hospitales sin fines de lucro quedarán exentos para fines de desarrollo económico.
- No se harán ajustes a la tarifa para fines de investigación y desarrollo de construcción.
- La tarifa no será modificada anualmente en correlación con el índice de costo de construcción.
