What do YOU need from the City of San Diego?

I ran for public office for one sole purpose – to work on your behalf to get things done for our community. After successfully tackling a wide variety of issues, I now need your input as we approach our next budget season. Mayor Faulconer's five-year financial outlook projects a \$74 million deficit for FY 2020 which starts July 1 despite a strong economy and revenue increases. Your voice is vital to ensuring that your priorities are seen and heard.

As Chair of the City Council's Budget and Government Efficiency Committee, I am determined to address issues that are important to you and not just "special interests."

Some of the issues I'm undertaking include: developing new sources of revenue related to scooters, examining where the city has vacancies and how to prioritize filling them, improving how the City of San Diego connects with small businesses, and making sure our streets are in good repair.

Now YOUR voice needs to be heard! What are YOUR top budget priorities? What city services matter the most to YOU? Tell me at our community budget forum on Saturday, May 4th from 10:30 to noon (more details on page 2).

In order to hear from as many constituents as possible, the Budget Committee will also hold two evening

meetings downtown on Wednesday, May 1 and Monday, May 6 at 6 p.m. But I know San Diegans live busy lives, so you always have the option of contacting my office directly to provide input on YOUR city budget priorities.

I know my role as Budget Chair is even more critical to ensuring both the stability and the growth of San Diego's economy. Know that I will continue to fight for the city services that affect and improve the daily lives of the citizens of San Diego.

Mid-Coast Trolley Underpass, SANDAG Project:



The trolley is on schedule to be completed 2021. As construction continues, we wanted to provide an update.

Overnight closures of La Jolla Colony Drive began in March for construction of the Trolley underpass. Lanes on La Jolla Colony Drive have been reconfigured to provide one lane in each direction for the duration of construction. Work ac-

tivities will also include drilling, excavation, removal of dirt and concrete construction. Construction is expected to be completed in late 2019. For more information on this project, visit KeepSanDiegoMov-ing.com/MidCoastTrolley

Gilman Drive Bridge, SANDAG and Caltrans Project:

The Gilman Drive Bridge celebrated its official opening in early February. Additional striping, sidewalks and crosswalk improvements adjacent to the project site were completed as part of the Medical Center Drive South Improvement Project. The next phase of construction includes earth work underneath the bridge in preparation for slope paving, installation of metal hand pipe railing and landscaping.



UC San Diego Mesa Housing Pedestrian and Bike Bridge, UC San Diego Project:

Girders, or the large support beams for the bridge, were delivered in March for the Mesa Housing side of the project. Additional girders for the project are scheduled to be delivered in April for the midcenter side. For that delivery, trucks will route from the I-5 freeway to Gilman Drive to Campus and across the Gilman Drive Bridge. Drivers may experience slight delays along this route during girder delivery.
