Del Mar Heights District 1 Residents, Avoid Extra Fees at the DMV

If you live in the Del Mar Heights area, but are a resident of the City of San Diego, you may have paid an extra 1% to the DMV when transferring the ownership of your vehicle. The City of Del Mar assesses a 1% fee on transfers of ownership in addition to the county and state fees the City of San Diego requires. To avoid the additional 1% fee, San Diego City residents living within the Del Mar Heights area should use the address "San Diego, CA 92014" instead of "Del Mar, CA 92014" when submitting your transfer of ownership form. The DMV can provide a form if you are a San Diego resident and would like to seek a refund for this 1% fee. Please note that the DMV cannot issue a refund if the fee was paid more than three years ago. Please contact Justine Murray at irmurray@sandiego.gov for assistance with the refund process.
