PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project provides for proposed hard-court improvements will include chain link fencing, concrete or asphalt court, basketball standards, rims and backboards or tennis nets and posts, and court surfacing with court markings at five park locations: Silver Wing Community Park, Willie Henderson Sports Complex, Southcrest Community Park, Encanto Community Park and Grant Hill Neighborhood Park. All work would occur within the public right-of-way in previously disturbed and nonsensitive areas only. Storm Water Best Management Practices (BMPs) for erosion control preventing discharge, as well as a Traffic Control Plan (TCP) would be implemented throughout construction.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: Categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301(c) (Existing Facilities).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not

have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301(c) (Existing Facilities) which consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alterations of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical equipment, or topographical features involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use including existing highways and streets, sidewalks, gutters, bicycle and pedestrian trails, and similar facilities. The exceptions to the exemptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; and no historical resources would be affected by the action. As to the exception for hazardous materials, there are three closed case locations listed on GeoTracker and one open evaluation case location listed on Envirostor within the Grant Hill Neighborhood Park 1,000 feet of the public right-of-way. There is one inactive case location listed on Envirostor within the Southcrest Community Park 1,000 of public right-of-way. There are two inactive case locations listed on Envirostor within the Willie Henderson Sports Complex 1,000 of public right-of-way. While one evaluation case location listed is open, there are no open environmental cases of known hazardous material contamination that would be disturbed which would otherwise preclude use of a CEQA exemption pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
