NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME/NUMBER: Safe Parking Program – SDCCU Stadium

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Mission Valley

COUNCIL DISTRICT: District 7

LOCATION: SDCCU Stadium, 9449 Friars Rd, San Diego, CA 92108

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The Safe Parking Program provides a secure location for individuals and families experiencing homelessness to park in overnight. The Second Amendment to the Agreement between the City of San Diego and Jewish Family Service to Provide Services for the Expanded Safe Parking Program would amend the Agreement to include an additional location for safe parking, increase the number of individuals served by the safe parking program, and allow for proper social distancing between cars and clients as recommended by the CDC during the COVID-19 emergency. The San Diego County Credit Union (SDCCU) Stadium parking lot located at 9449 Friars Rd, San Diego, CA 92108, would be open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. This safe parking lot is a temporary location and a direct response to the COVID-19 emergency crisis. Clients from the Mission Valley safe parking lot will be relocated to the SDCCU Stadium lot during this period.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This activity is statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15269(c) (Emergency Projects) and 15359 (Emergency).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

This action is exempt from CEQA pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Sections 15269(c) (Emergency Projects) and 15359 (Emergency). This action is necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency, and is also necessary to address a sudden and unexpected occurrence involving a clear and imminent danger, demanding immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss of, or damage to, life, health, property, or essential public services related to the novel coronavirus - COVID-19 pandemic. The COVID-19 pandemic, if left unaddressed, will result in an immediate public health crisis, and this action is necessary to prevent or mitigate loss of life, health, and essential public services. Specifically, ensuring additional and adequate distancing for the City's Safe Parking Program is critical to mitigate this immediate public health crisis and ensure the safety of the individuals using the program.

Applications to appeal the CEQA determination to the City Council must be filed with the Office of the Clerk within 10 business days from the date of the posting of this Notice (**April 29, 2020**). During the Statewide "Safer-at-Home" directive to reduce the spread of COVID-19, beginning March 19, 2020, appeals to the City Clerk must be filed by email or US Mail as follows:

1. Appeals filed via Email: Send the appeal by email to Hearings1@sandiego.gov; your email appeal will be acknowledged within 24 hours. You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City of San Diego Planning Department, Attn: Elena Pascual, 9485 Aero Drive, San Diego, CA 92123**. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
2. Appeals filed via US Mail: Send the appeal by US Mail to **City Clerk/Appeal, MS 2A, 202 C Street, San Diego, CA 92101**. Appeals filed by US Mail must have a United States Postal Service (USPS) postmark by the appeal deadline to be considered valid. You must separately mail the required appeal fee by check payable to the City Treasurer to: **City of San Diego Planning Department, Attn: Elena Pascual, 9485 Aero Drive, San Diego, CA 92123**. The appeal filing fee must be postmarked within 5 business days of the date the appeal is filed.
