Additional Traffic Control Setup and Upcoming Work Near Clairemont Village Shopping Center

This week, crews will set up traffic control on Clairemont Drive between Burgener Blvd. and Iroquois Ave., in front of the Clairemont Village Shopping Center. After the traffic control is set up, they'll begin work to install pipeline in the street. Work through this area will occur at night to reduce impacts to the nearby businesses.

As work progresses, crews will continue to move east up Clairemont Drive and the traffic control will move along with them. For your safety and the safety of the crews, please follow all posted signage when you're in the work zone. Bus stops located within the work zone will be temporarily relocated as-needed.

Within the work zone, please expect noise, dust, and construction equipment to be staged.

Night work hours will be from 9 p.m. to 5 a.m.



Pure Water San Diego is the City of San Diego's phased, multi-year program that will provide nearly half of San Diego's water supply locally by 2035. Pure Water San Diego will use proven water purification technology to clean recycled water to produce safe, high-quality drinking water. The Program offers a cost-effective investment for San Diego's water needs and will provide a reliable, sustainable water supply.

Phase 1 includes several projects that will clean recycled water to produce 30 million gallons per day (mgd) of high-quality purified water, reducing the City of San Diego's dependence on imported water.
