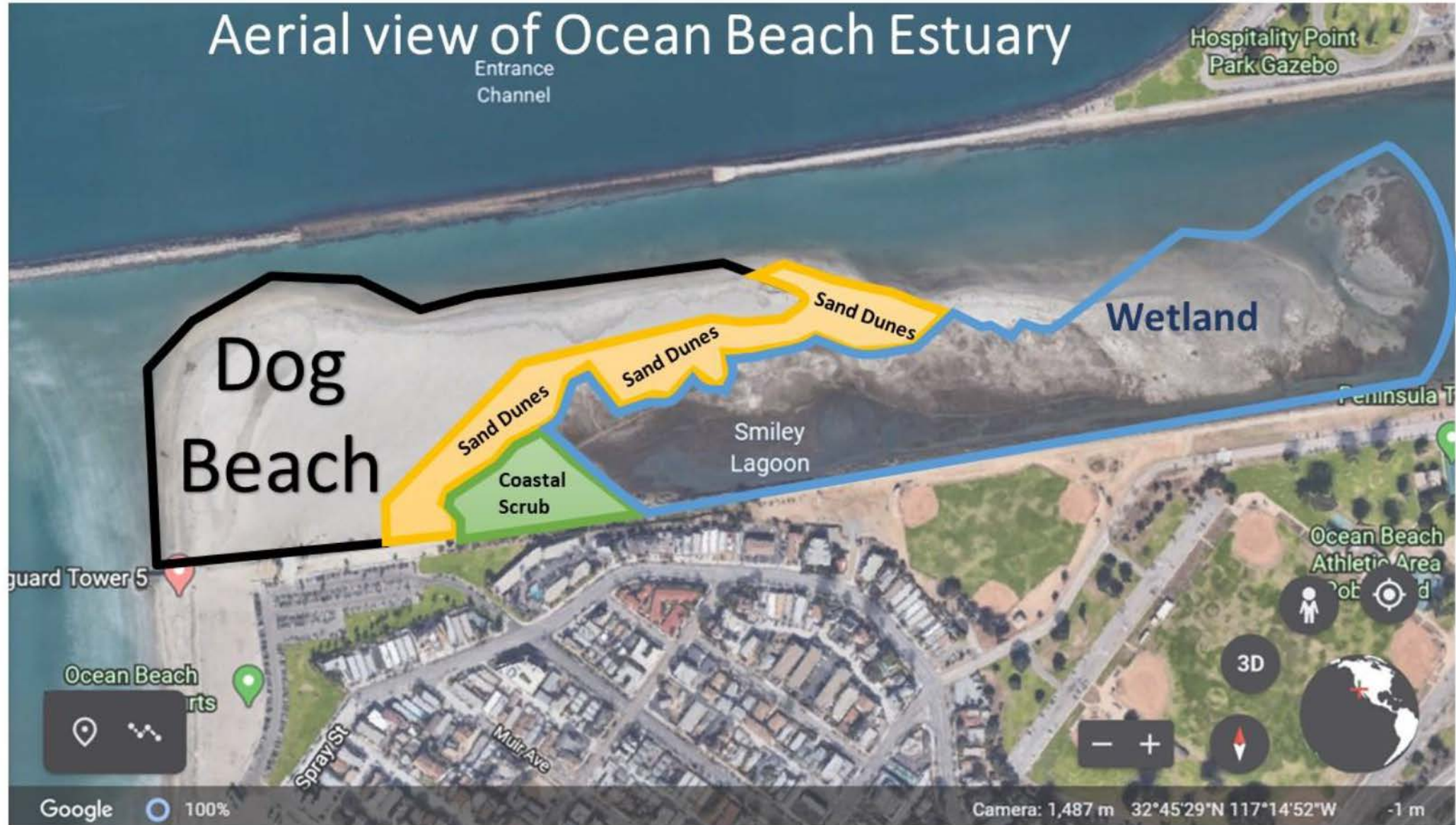
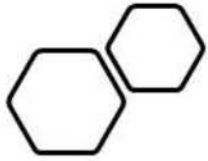

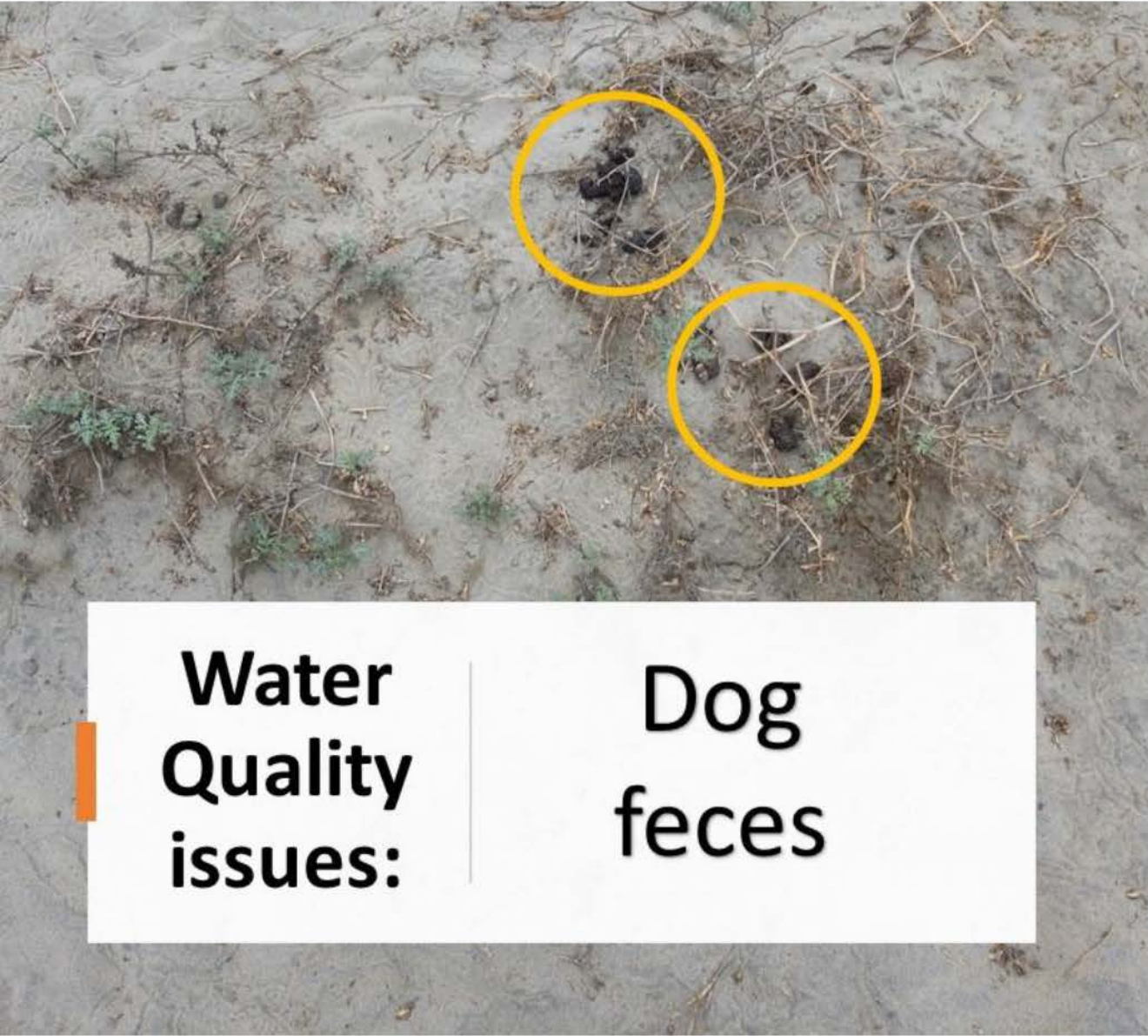


Aerial view of current paths and fence location
