Streets Assessment Show Major Improvements



As chair of the City's Infrastructure Committee, I've worked hard to ensure our streets get the level of attention and investment our residents deserve. We recently heard a new report showing all of that hard work is paying off.

A new street condition assessment shows 60 percent of streets now fall into the "good category" compared to 35 percent in 2011. In District Five, we have approximately 390 miles of roadway, the second most of any district in the city and in the current assessment, our streets are rated at 74, better than the citywide average of 72. This is due to a truly focused effort by

Mayor Faulconer, my Council colleagues, and the City Streets Division. We passed streamlining measures, increased funding and made it easier for residents to report street damage.

You can check out what your street was rated in the new assessment at the fully interactive <u>streets.sandiego.gov</u>. You'll also see if your street has been scheduled for repairs in the current FY17 budget, like Rancho Carmel Dr., Scripps Ranch Blvd., and West Bernardo Dr.

While we've made great progress, there is still a lot of work to do. If you see a street that needs repairs, use the Get it Done app or report it at <u>www.sandiego.gov/get-it-done</u>. Our pothole repair crew is scheduled to be in the district on October 4, 17 and 28 (schedule may change).

New Kids Playground Opens at RB Community Park

The new kids playground at Rancho Bernardo Community Park is now open thanks to the hard work and fundraising by the Kiwanis of the Rancheros. They raised more than \$125,000 including a grant from the District Five Community Projects, Programs and Services Fund. The new tot lot includes updated playground equipment, rubber padding and turf.

This was a great partnership with the local Kiwanis Club in Rancho Bernardo. I look forward to seeing our youth enjoy the new play area for many years to come.

Located in Rancho Bernardo, Microtek is an engineering and R&D startup founded in 2015 that is creating products to improve human health. The company specializes in miniaturization for advanced microelectronics products. Microtek's mission is to deliver novel life sciences services, devices, and therapeutics to improve human health. They provide innovative product development by incorporating microelectronics manufacturing, engineering, bioscience, and pharmaceutical strategies.



I had the opportunity to visit their offices recently for a tour and I learned about the new technologies they are developing including a miniaturized microelectronic controlled oral drug delivery system that would allow for programmed release of therapeutic doses.

Pure Water Tour with Councilman Kersey October 22

The public is invited to Pure Water Day, a free open house event at the North City Water Reclamation Plant on Saturday, October 22. The first phase of the Pure Water Program is underway and includes the design and construction of the North City Pure Water Facility across the street from the North City Water Reclamation Plant. This facility will produce 30 million gallons per day of purified water.

Tour the demonstration Pure Water Facility and taste the water with Councilmember Mark Kersey at 10:30 a.m. The event will include fun educational activities for youth, refreshments and information about the phase one North City projects. If you aren't able to attend at 10:30 a.m., tours will take place throughout the day.

At full build-out, Pure Water San Diego will produce 83 million gallons of purified water per day and will be part of the water supply for all communities in San Diego.
