The 290 Unit is responsible for processing all Civil Unrest 2020 Protest related arrests and crime reports with related arrests. The 290 Unit will be coordinating with the Issuing Unit of the appropriate prosecutor (DA or CA).

Officers who arrest someone or take a crime report related to the Civil Unrest 2020 Protests shall complete the crime or arrest reports within 24 hours of the incident. All reports and evidence shall be sent to the 290 Unit. The 290 Unit will evaluate crime reports and those without an associated arrest will be routed to the respective command where the incident occurred.

Any arrest already completed by an area station or centralized investigator needs to be forwarded to the 290 Unit for tracking purposes by June 8, 2020. Any arrest assigned to an investigator which has not been completed needs to be transferred to the 290 Unit for final disposition by June 6, 2020.

Any handwritten arrest or crime reports, field interviews, citations, or other documents not submitted into NetRMS shall be placed into the bin in the Watch Commanders Office within 24 hours of completion.
