

### **PD** Proposal Questions

- April 27<sup>th</sup>: PD presentation to full PAB; PAB invitation to meet and work collaboratively with PD on proposal
- May 10<sup>th</sup>: Through City Staff, submitted list of questions along with invitation to meet with PD. Question topics included:
  - Vendor identity, capabilities, and sharing practices; contracts in place
  - Technical specifications
  - Program design and management, including locations and number of units
  - Process, uses, and internal policies
  - Community engagement
  - What other municipalities have done
  - Costs, benefits, and consequences
  - Constitutional and legal concerns
- May 12<sup>th</sup>: Through City Staff, extended invitation to meet with PD; requested information about vendor identity and contracts, if any
- May 25<sup>th</sup>: Extended invitation to meet with PD

  - Security and privacy concerns with vendors generally\*
