- I. <u>Call to Order</u> Commissioner Vernon Franck called the City of San Diego (City) Commission for Arts and Culture's Public Art Committee (PAC) to order at 9:37 a.m. at the office of the Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission), Civic Center Plaza, 1200 Third Avenue, Floor 9, Suite 924, San Diego, California 92101.

## III. Chair's Reports

- A. <u>Commission Business</u> Commissioner Vernon Franck reported that at the May 25, 2018 Commission meeting, the Commission recommended that the Acting Executive Director of the Commission for Arts and Culture accept the final artwork proposal by Roman de Salvo for Mission Trails Field Station in fulfillment of the City's collecting mission, collection scope and accession criteria.

C. <u>Other Reports</u> – Commissioner Vernon Franck reported that the UCSD Stuart Collection is soon adding a new artwork to their collection by Mark Bradford titled *What Hath God Wrought?* Franck noted that he is working as a surveyor for the project and invited PAC members to a public event on October 6, 2018 during which the artwork will be installed.

## IV. ACTIONS

A. <u>Final Artwork Proposal for East Village Green by Mark Reigelman</u> – Christine E. Jones, Acting Executive Director, provided background on the East Village Green Public Art Project and the artwork development process. Jones noted that Mark Reigelman could not attend the meeting due to a scheduled installation. Jones presented the final artwork proposal. PAC members provided feedback and asked questions regarding the proposal. Questions from PAC were focused on providing context for the artwork at the site and anticipated public interactions. Linda Caballero Sotelo arrived at 10:15 a.m. Derrick Cartwright made a motion to recommend to the Commission that the Acting Executive Director of the Commission accept the final artwork proposal by Mark Reigelman in fulfillment of the City's collecting mission, collection scope and accession criteria as established in Section 5 – Collecting Mission, Section 6 – Scope of the Collection and Section 8.2 – Accession Criteria of the Commission's Department Instruction 1.00 – Collection Management Policy for the Civic Art Collection. Linda Caballero Sotelo seconded the motion. The vote was 7-0-0; the motion passed.

B. Artist Evaluation Criteria for FY2019 2 Percent for Art Public Art Projects – Commissioner Vernon Franck introduced the item and asked for comments on the artist evaluation Criteria for FY2019 2 Percent for Art Public Art Projects. PAC discussed the benefit of including language in the criteria regarding site and context and addition of "public spaces" to one of the bulleted criterion as follows: Demonstrated artistic and technical skills necessary for this project, such as education and training as an artist, exhibition record, previous site-specific commissions, and other related activities indicative of artistic achievement or experience in successfully completing previous site-specific commissions in public spaces of similar scope, scale, budget, and complexity. Derrick Cartwright made a motion to recommend the Artist Evaluation Criteria for FY2019 2 Percent for Art Public Art Projects with the edit. Larry Herzog seconded the motion. The vote was 7-0-0; the motion passed.
