SUBJECT: Artist Selection Panelists for Exposure

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Advise the City of San Diego Commission for Arts and Culture (Commission) to recommoned the following panelists for the *Exposure*: 1) one Public Art Committee member, plus one alternate member; 2) scott b. davis for the seat of the visual art professionals #1, 3) Tiffany Wai-Ying Beres for the seat of the visual art/design professional #2, with recommended alternates, in no particular order, to serve as three of the five ad hoc artist selection panelists.

#### **SUMMARY:**

City of San Diego (City) staff will administer the artist selection for Exposure, San Diego's first-ever municipal photo fellowship designed to provide a platform for artists to explore civic and social issues facing San Diego through the medium of photography. Staff, under oversight from the City's Purchasing and Contracting Department, will conduct a request for qualifications process open to professional practicing artists working with the medium of photography and residing in San Diego County. The artist selected for the pilot *Exposure* fellowship 2023–2024 through the competitive process will serve as the photo fellow for the City's Welcoming San Diego initiative. The artist selected for the fellowship will be expected to develop a framework for exploration and experimentation in new approaches to visual storytelling, which will result in the creation of a temporary project and representative body of photographic artwork for the City's Civic Art Collection. The project and body of artwork is expected to support the implementation of the City's Welcoming San Diego initiative, which is designed to advance the civic, social, and economic integration of immigrants in the most vibrant cross-border mega region in North America. The anticipated total budget for the fellowship is approximately \$75,000. The fellowship is made possible through the City and a grant from the National Endowment for the Arts. The fellowship anticipated to begin in the spring of 2023 and continue through October 2024.

The artist selection panel for *Exposure* will be composed of five voting members: one Public Art Committee member, two visual art professionals, and two Office of Immigrant Affairs representatives. City staff members will attend the panel meetings as non-voting advisors. The Public Art Committee is authorized to recommend appointment of three of the five panel seats for the fellowship.

scott b. davis, Artist and Executive Director, Medium Photo

**scott b. davis** is an artist and founder of Medium Photo, a non-profit organization that produces workshops, exhibitions, artist lectures, and an annual festival for emerging and established fine art photographers. A widely exhibited fine art photographer, davis creates photographs with wooden view cameras. He makes prints by hand using a labor-intensive 19<sup>th</sup> century process known as platinum printing. His work has been reviewed in the New York Times, the Village Voice, the New

Yorker, Los Angeles Times, and other print media. davis's photographs have been collected by the J. Paul Getty Museum, Los Angeles County Museum of Art, Pier 24 in San Francisco, the Nelson Atkins Museum of Art, the Santa Barbara Museum of Art, Museum of Photographic Arts, and others. A monograph of his work titled scott b. davis: sonora was published by Radius Books in 2021.

#### Panel Seat 3

Tiffany Wai-Ying Beres, Curator and Art Historian

Tiffany Wai-Ying Beres is a curator and art historian who is based in San Diego. She is interested in the transnational flows of visual culture that characterize the global art world and the ways that technology can facilitate cultural exchange. Specializing in both ancient and contemporary Asian art, her scholarly research explores the interpretation and reconceptualization of antiquity in contemporary contexts. Her practice is dedicated to highlighting overlooked narratives and to rethinking curatorial practice to facilitate critical dialogues, build communities, and make art more accessible. Beres has curated more than 30 exhibition projects for museums and institutions around the world such as Out of the Shadows: Contemporary Chinese Photography at the Museum of Photographic Arts in San Diego, Liu Jianhua: Collected Letters at the Asian Art Museum in San Francisco, From Two Arises Three: The Collaborative Works of Arnold Chang and Michael Cherney at the Hong Kong University Museum and Art Gallery, and more. Previously, Beres was based in Beijing, where she worked with artists and published extensively about topics in Asian contemporary art for publications such as Orientations, The Asian Art Newspaper, Art AsiaPacific, and the Wall Street Journal.
