

Proper Graffiti removal varies for different surfaces

Organize a "paint bank" with shared paints and equipment.



Removal within 24 to 48 hours reduces the chance of long-term repetitive re-occurrence.



REMOVE:

2-1-1 San Diego Operates the City's Paint Bank and the graffiti hotline; process service request for graffiti removal services on public or private property and schedules paint pick up appointments from the Paint bank.
