

SAMPLE BALLOT--General Election, April 8, 1913

INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTERS:

To vote for a candidate of your selection, stamp a cross (X) in the voting square next to the right of the name of such candidate. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, stamp a cross (X) after the names of all of the candidates for that office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates who are to be elected. If the ballot does not contain the names of candidates for all offices for which you may desire to vote, you may vote for candidates for such offices so omitted, by writing the name of the candidate for whom you wish to vote in the blank space left for that purpose. To vote for a person not on the ballot write the name of such person under the title of the office in the blank space left for that purpose. To vote on any question or proposition stamp a cross (X) in the voting square after the word "Yes" or after the word "No," and if the word "Yes" or "No" is not printed at the right of the proposition stamp a cross (X) at the right of such proposition as you wish to vote for or against, but do not stamp a cross (X) for and against any one proposition. All marks except the cross (X) are forbidden. All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void. If you wrongly stamp, tear or deface this ballot return it to the inspector of the election and obtain another.
