MUNICIPAL TICKET GENERAL ELECTION

Instructions to Voters: To vote for a candidate of your selection, stamp a cross (X) in the voting square to the right of the name of such candidate. Where two or more candidates for the same office are to be elected, stamp a cross (X) after the names of all of the candidates for that office for whom you desire to vote, not to exceed, however, the number of candidates who are to be elected. To vote for a person not on the ballot write the name of such person under the title of the office in the blank space left for that purpose. If you desire to ratify any proposition contained herein, for the amendment of the Charter of the City of San Diego, stamp a cross (X) in the voting square at the right of and opposite the word "Yes", which is in the square at the right of such proposition. If you desire to vote not to ratify any proposition contained herein, for the amendment of the Charter of said City, stamp a cross (X) in the voting square at the right of and opposite the word "No", which is in the square at the right of such proposition. All marks except the cross (X) are forbidden. All distinguishing marks or erasures are forbidden and make the ballot void. If you wrongly stamp, tear or deface this ballot return it to the inspector of the election and obtain another.

The amendment also provides for hearing before the Civil Service Commission, which is authorized to either discharge the employee or to reinstate him on the eligible list.
