### PROPOSITION TO BE VOTED UPON

**PROPOSITION 1.** Shall the City of San Diego incur a bonded indebtedness of \$2,750,000.00 for the acquisition, construction and completion of a pipe line from Otay Reservoir to University Heights Reservoir; to enlarge Chollas Heights Reservoir; to enlarge and construct spillway at Morena Dam and Reservoir; for pumps and equipment, pipe lines and wells and rights of way for pumping water from bed of San Diego River, and conducting same to City Reservoirs; for completion of filter units at Otay Reservoir, Torrey Pines Reservoir and University Heights Reservoir; for acquiring water rights and rights of way, and making preliminary borings and excavations for the construction of a reservoir at Marron Dam Site, and for water-bearing lands and rights of way in Tia Juana River Valley; for securing land and making preliminary borings and excavations for increasing height of dam and capacity of Barrett Reservoir, and securing rights of way; for preliminary borings, excavations and surveys for dam or dams on San Diego River, and obtaining necessary lands and rights of way therefor; for purchasing water-bearing lands in San Dieguito River Valley; for purchasing minor rights of way and securing of options on land needed in connection with various and sundry portions of the City water system; and for preliminary borings, excavations and rights of way for completing and increasing capacity of Hodges Reservoir.

### PROPOSITIONS TO BE VOTED UPON

**PROPOSITION I.** Amend Section 13½, Chapter II, Article VI of the City Charter. This amendment removes the present limitation in the charter with respect to the amount of bonds which may be issued by the City for purpose of securing property and works suitable and proper for supplying the City with water, and provides that for such purposes bonds may be issued in an amount not to exceed twenty-five per cent of the assessed value of all real and personal property of said City, in addition to the bonds issued or authorized for other purposes, when authorized by a vote of two-thirds of the electors voting at an election held for that purpose.

**PROPOSITION II.** Amend Sub-section 40 of Section 1, Chapter II, Article II of the City Charter. The effect of this amendment is to enable the City Council to expend whatever sums may be deemed necessary by them for the employment of special counsel.

**PROPOSITION III.** Amend Sub-section 48 (a) of Section 1, Chapter II, Article II of the City Charter. This amendment provides that the City pueblo lands lying north of the San Diego River shall be reserved from sale until the year 1940, instead of the year 1930, as now provided.

**PROPOSITION IV.** Amend Section 16, Chapter II, Article II of the City Charter. The effect of this amendment is to provide that all advertising shall be let by contract to the lowest bidder after published notice, omitting the limitation on prices thereof contained in the present charter.

**PROPOSITION V.** Amend Chapter VIII, Article V of the City Charter, by adding thereto a new section, to be known and numbered as Section 4. This amendment provides that the Common Council shall levy annually, in addition to all other taxes provided for city purposes, ten cents on each one hundred dollars valuation of property taxable for municipal purposes, for
