

The construction, reconstruction, of repair of public buildings, streets, unification of the public works, and rerials, equipment or contractual services for the same, or for other use by the City, when the expendi-ture therefor shall exceed the sum of one thousand dollars, the same shall be done by written contract, except as otherwise provided in this Charter, and the Council on the rec-ommendation of the Manager or the head of the Department in charge, if not under the Manager's jurisdiction, shall let the same to the lowest re-sponsible and reliable bidder, not for six consecutive days in a news-paper of general circulation in the City for sealed propocals for the work contemplated, provided, how-ever, that the Council upon the rec-ommendation of the Manager and by a vote of five of its members may order the performance of any such construction and reconstruction or pations indicate that the work can be done by the City forces more co-nomically than if let by contract; provided, further, that upon the Council by resolution may order the burchase, without advertising for may agency thereof, or from any other public corporation, state or municipal, or any agency thereof. Any contract may be let for a gross price or on a unit basis and may provide for liquidated damages to the City for every day the contract is uncompleted beyond a specified date. It shall be completion, provide, that when any award has been made in consideration, in whole or in part, of the relative time esti-mates of bidders for the completion of the work, the performance in ac-cordance with such time limits shall be secured by a surety bond as hereinabove provided with adequate further, that for any contract awardied solely or partially on a specified time for completion the Council shall not extend such time limits unless such extension be recommended by the Manager and the Head of the Department con-certed.
