HOW TO SPEAK TO A PARTICULAR ITEM DURING PUBLIC COMMENT:

In Person for Agenda Items and Non-Agenda Public Comment: Please fill out a speaker slip located at the entrance to the meeting. Indicate the item you wish to speak on as well as other requested information. Then submit it to the Chairperson at the box indicated near the speaker's lectern at the front of the room.

<u>Via Virtual Platform for Agenda Items and Non-Agenda Public Comment:</u> When the Chairperson introduces the item (or indicates it is time for Non-Agenda Public Comment), raise your hand by either tapping the "Raise Your Hand" button on your computer, tablet, or Smartphone, or by dialing *9 on your phone. You will be taken in the order in which you raised your hand. You may only speak once on a particular item.

When the Chairperson indicates it is your turn to speak, unmute your phone by tapping the Unmute button on your computer, tablet or Smartphone, or dial *6 on your phone.

Please Note: Members of the public who wish to provide virtual testimony must enter the virtual queue by raising their hand before the queue closes. The queue will close when the last virtual speaker finishes speaking or five minutes after in-person testimony ends, whichever happens first. **Those participating virtually may NOT cede time to others participating in person or virtually.**

A General Plan/Community Plan Amendment to re-designate the land use from Open Space To Medium Density Residential; A Rezone from AR-1-2 and OF-1-1 to RM-2-5; A Tentative Map to divide one parcel into two; A Site Development Permit; A Local Coastal Program Amendment to create consistency with the proposed Community Plan amendment and Coastal Development Permit; Neighborhood Development Permit for proposed deviations; and a Multihabitat Planning Area Boundary Line Adjustment to construct 380 multifamily units within two parcels (North [280 Units] and South Neighborhood [100 Units]).

The 14.62-Acre site is located at 408 Hollister Street.
