To the HONORABLE MAYOR and COMMON COUNCIL of the CITY OF SAN DIEGO:

Your Petitioners, property owners and/or residents on and near Voltaire Street, Ocean Beach, respectfully request immediate reconsideration of the petition of MARSHALL MALCOLM for a license to open and carry on a dance hall business at 4862 Voltaire Street, Ocean Beach, and request that his application for license be revoked or denied for the following reasons:

I.

That the neighborhood adjacent to said address is essentially residential, and that the businesses now open along the said street are confined to those dispensing household necessities.

II.

That the noise, hilarity, and night-time disturbances usually and necessarily indicental to the conduct of a public dance hall is, and will become, a nuisance to the home owners and tenants in the neighborhood.

III.

That the granting of such license will depreciate the value of all residential property in the neighborhood, in that it will make these homes undesirable, largely unsalable, and seriously impair the rental values thereof. That the disturbances surrounding such business disturb the night-time rest and security and the general moral tone of the neighborhood.

IV.

That there are well-defined amusement centers at Ocean Beach and at Mission Beach, and it is not necessary that residential neighborhoods be opened to the conduct of such amusements.

That a public hearing of the petition of Mr. Marshall

Malcolm for a dance hall license at 4862 Voltaire Street, Ocean Beach, was heretofore noticed for the 28th day of May, before the Council, and at said time various residents and property owners of Ocean Beach attended such meeting to oppose the issuance of the said license; that after a hearing thereon the Mayor and Council members publicly voted that the said application be tabled, and at said time it was generally made known to the public there present that the tabling of such application was final; however, the said application was again called up on the 4th day of June, 1934, without notice to or the knowledge of the opponents of the said application, and such application was then granted; wherefore, the opponents of said measure believe they have been misled and deprived of a full opportunity to fully make known their objections to the said license.

VI.

That the granting of said license was opposed by an official letter of Mr. Peterson, Chief of Police, addressed to the City Manager, which letter recommended that the application be denied, whereupon such denial was recommended by the said City Manager; and your petitioners believe that your honorable body overlooked this fact and failed to give it due consideration.

WHEREFORE, your Petitioners earnestly request that this matter be reopened so that these objections may be fully considered.
