## TRANSPORTATION AND STORM WATER DEPARTMENT August 7, 2018

AMENDMENT TO THE LAND DEVELOPMENT MANUAL - STORM WATER STANDARDS

The City of San Diego Storm Water Standards Manual Part 2 is being updated to include the Storm Water Pollution Prevention Plan (SWPPP) Checklist, Weather Triggered Action Plan (WTAP) and other clarifications on the construction best management practice (BMP) requirements.

In May 2013, the California Regional Water Quality Control Board for the San Diego Region (SDRWQCB) reissued a municipal storm water, National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit (Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System [MS4] Permit) that covered its region. The MS4 Permit reissuance to the San Diego County Co-permittees went into effect in 2013 (Order No. R9-2013-0001).

The reissued MS4 Permit updates and expands storm water requirements for new development and redevelopment projects. The MS4 Permit was amended in February 2015 by Order R9-2015-0001, and again in November 2015 by Order R9-2015-0100.

The Storm Water Standards Manual, which is a component of the Land Development Manual, conforms to the 2013 Municipal Permit. This Manual provides procedural guidelines, submittal requirements and design tools to provide added clarity and assist project proponents in meeting the 2013 Municipal Permit requirements, including the use of Phase 1 of the Offsite Storm Water Alternative Compliance Program.

Thank you for taking the time to review the first draft of the Storm Water Standards Manual Part 2 and provide comments during the initial 30-day review period from December 13, 2017 to January 16, 2018. The updated final draft considers the input that was received. **The final 30-day review period will begin on August 7, 2018 and end on September 10, 2018.** The effective date of the Storm Water Standards Manual will be October 1, 2018.

In accordance with Section 111.0106 of the Land Development Code, the City is proposing to amend the Storm Water Standards of the Land Development Manual.
