 - Activities include movies, free food for youth, games/activities, game truck, foam, DJ/music, and much more
 - Successful launch this past weekend (7/14/22-7/16/22) at three locations – City Heights, Linda Vista, and Skyline Hills – with attendance around 150-200 people per site on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings last week
 - Program will continue every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday evenings from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at these three sites through the remainder of July and August

 - Goal is to create digital equity by offering free internet at public facilities including parks and libraries

- Vacancies
 - The Department continues to have between 100 and 130 permanent, full-time vacant positions. These include grounds maintenance workers, mid-level supervisors, recreation staff, and a variety of office and administrative staff.
 - The Department continues to do what it can to fill all vacant positions and ensure each recreation center and pool has sufficient staff to allow for regular operations.
- Parks Master Plan (Parks for All of Us):
 - Today, Recreation Services Program Manager Sarah Erazo will present draft guiding principles for obtaining public input later this summer and fall related to the newly created Opportunity Fund, which began collecting funding as of 7/1/22
 - Leagues have reached out to Department staff about fee calculations as related to the Opportunity Fund; we are currently working to address those concerns to prevent large increases in fee costs for sports leagues year-over-year
 - In September, staff will present an update on the Citywide Park Development Impact Fee including a draft framework for use of those funds for various capital improvement projects

 - 50th Anniversary of Therapeutic Recreation Services at the Park de la Cruz Community Center was on 6/18/22 with proclamation issued by Mayor Gloria and Council President Elo-Rivera
 - Island Avenue Mini Park reopened to the public with new play equipment on 6/20/22
 - $_{\odot}$ San Ysidro Teen Center at the Old San Ysidro Library opened to the public on 7/11/22
 - Memorial Park Dog Off Leash Area Grand Opening coming this Friday 7/22/22 at 11:00 a.m.
 - National Carousel Day is coming 7/25/22 at Balboa Park in partnership with Forever Balboa Park

- Press Conference of Balboa Park Botanical Building with Mayor Todd Gloria and Senator Pro Tem Toni Atkins will be 7/29/22 at 10 a.m.
- Sidewalk Vending Ordinance:
 - The effective date of enforcement of sidewalk vending ordinance was on 6/22/22
 - With the summer moratorium in effect, most of Balboa Park no longer has sidewalk vendors, which has helped open areas for First Amendment/Free Speech practitioners as was common prior to the arrival of sidewalk vendors
 - While staff cannot enforce the sidewalk vending ordinance at coastal parks until the California Coastal Commission approves it, other existing SDMC sections are being enforced, including requirements not to leave vendor items overnight
 - Gratitude and thanks to Chief Park Ranger Michael Ruiz for his leadership and management of the implementation of the sidewalk vending ordinance
 - Today, you will hear more details from Chief Ruiz under Item 202
- Pickleball
 - Still working to develop space for pickleball and continue to work with both tennis and pickleball advocates
- Questions from Last Meeting
 - Fault Line Park Proposed Dog Off Leash Area
 - Attendee Ms. Kristy Shephard requested an update on when a dog off leash area would be added at Fault Line Park
 - That project is still under discussion; in the meantime, two new dog off leash areas are under construction at both Children's Park and East Village Green
 - o <u>Area Committees</u>
 - Attendee Ms. Daniele Laman asked whether Council Policy 600-33 requires approvals of General Development Plans (GDPs) to be approved by the Area Committees before they are considered by the Park and Recreation Board
 - Currently, Council Policy 600-33 does not require Area Committees to consider GDPs
 - GDPs are required to be considered by Community Recreation Groups and the Park and Recreation Board
 - Ms. Laman also asked where agendas are posted for Area Committees and who to contact to request agenda items

201. Draft Recreation Element, Mira Mesa Community Plan Update

PUBLIC COMMENT on Item #201

Commenter Name:	Summary of Comment:
Howard Greenstein	Mr. Greenstein recommended the draft recreation element should show the Recreation Value Point (RVP) calculations for parkland and show how much land would be provided. Mr. Greenstein feels the land component should be included in the calculation. He also asked how many points for land to be incorporated. The matrix should reflect this component to be transparent for the public.
Joe Frichtel	Mr. Frichtel expressed concerns with the size of Mira Mesa population and limited park acres and facilities available for the community. He pointed out that we are faced of shortage of facilities to provide recreation facilities to the growing population in Mira Mesa. Mr. Frost responded that despite of shortage they are adding more than 17 miles of trails and incorporated to the plan the expansion of park lands. Mr. Sandel pointed out that they add a column to list the acres for expansion. Ms. Bothwell also pointed out that the private land access should be incorporated to the report. Mr Sandel responded that they have the matrix per Council Policy 600-33.

Board Member Comment on Item #201

Jon Becker	Mr. Becker requested staff clarify how it plans to quantify the points for the trails system. Mr. Sandel responded that they would have this on the matrix table.
Dennis Otsuji	Mr. Otsuji asked Mr. Frichtel about Miramar College and whether the City has a great working relationship with them. Mr. Frichtel responded that he's also an active board member for Miramar College and knows that the college has a great working relationship with the City given the existing joint use at Hourglass Field and Ned Baumer Swimming Pool. Mr. Otsuji also asked whether the City and San Diego Unified School District have a joint use arrangement at Mira Mesa High School. Mr. Sandel responded that no joint use at the high school currently.

202. Sidewalk Vending Regulations in Parks & Beaches

Daniele Laman	Ms. Laman asked if roaming vendors are allowed in the international cottages area in Balboa Park. Chief Ruiz responded that sidewalk vending is prohibited. She also asked what would be done for December Nights as related to the sidewalk vendors. Chief Ruiz responded that vendors that have vendors permits are authorized to operate and will be allowed for December Nights.

David Baron	Mr. Baron pointed out the need for adequate health permits for sidewalk vendors and asked if County Health Department is also involved with this SVO. Chief Ruiz confirmed that we have partnership with the County of Health Department that helps us conduct health and safety training for the vendor to enforce the required health permits. Enforcement is effective on July 1, 2022.
Marcella Bothwell	Ms. Bothwell expressed that additional Ranger deployment are needed to help enforce Sidewalk Vending Ordinance (SVO). Chief Ruiz confirmed that we have been approved to hire additional rangers to help us with the enforcement of this new ordinance.
