SUBJECT:

De Anza Special Study Ad-Hoc Committee Member Nomination

SUMMARY

<u>Issue:</u> Should the Park and Recreation Board appoint a Park and Recreation Board member to serve on the Mission Bay Park Committee's De Anza Special Study Ad-Hoc Committee that will examine and plan for possible uses for the De Anza Revitalization Plan area in Mission Bay Park?

<u>Director's Recommendation:</u> Appoint a Park and Recreation Board Member to serve on the De Anza Special Study Ad-Hoc Committee.

BACKGROUND

The City began the planning process for the De Anza Revitalization Plan in November 2015, to give vision to the De Anza Special Study Area, identified in the Mission Bay Park Master Plan. The project is a three-year process that will result in an amendment to the Mission Bay Park Master Plan with approval from the City Council and Coastal Commission.

A critical component of the project is the De Anza Ad-hoc Committee, formed by the Mission Bay Park Committee, serving to collaborate on ideas with staff and the consultant team and give a voice to key community stakeholders. On November 19, 2015, the Park Board voted to have Vicki Granowitz represent the Park Board on the Ad-hoc Committee. Due to term limits imposed on Park and Recreation Board members, Vicki Granowitz can no longer represent the Park and Recreation Board on the Ad-hoc Committee, requiring a new nomination by the Board.
