<u>SUMMARY</u>

<u>Issue</u> – Should the Park and Recreation Board approve the renaming of the Carmel Valley Riparian Enhancement Project (CVREP) Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail"?

<u>Director's Recommendation</u> – The Department does not take a position on facility naming requests.

Other Recommendations -

- On July 26, 2016, the Ocean Air Recreation Council voted unanimously to endorse the renaming of the Carmel Valley Riparian Enhancement Project (CVREP) Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail". John Hardy, Chair.
- On July 28, 2016, the Carmel Valley Community Planning Board voted unanimously to request support for the renaming of the Carmel Valley Riparian Enhancement Project (CVREP) Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail". Frisco White, Chair. Letter sent to Open Space Senior Planner Paul Kilburg.
- On October 5, 2016, the Community Parks I Division Area Committee voted unanimously to approve endorse the renaming of the Carmel Valley Riparian Enhancement Project (CVREP) Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail". Dennis Otsuji, Chair.
- On October 18, 2016, the Friends of Los Penasquitos Canyon Preserve wrote a letter to Open Space Senior Planner Paul Kilburg detailing the Friends Board of Directors support for the renaming of the Carmel Valley Riparian Enhancement Project (CVREP) Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail". <u>Fiscal Impact</u> – None

BACKGROUND

A request was made by the public for this action. Marvin Gerst was a longtime resident and community advocate that played a key role in the preservation and expansion of trails and open space in Carmel Valley and Torrey Hills. The trail extends 3 miles from the eastern edge of the Palacio Del Mar neighborhood westward to El Camino Real south of Highway 56. Staff has assisted with processing this request in accordance with Park and Recreation Board Policy #1001, "Naming of Parks and Recreation Facilities" (copy attached). Background in support of the proposal is also attached.

DISCUSSION

The renaming of the CVREP Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail" in Honor of Marvin Gerst is in compliance with Park and Recreation Board Policy #1001. The community has also requested that a boulder/plaque be installed to identify the named area. This request would be considered by the Park and Recreation Department Director should the Park and Recreation Board approve the naming request.

ALTERNATIVES

Do not approve the renaming of the CVREP Trail to "The Marvin Gerst Trail".



Naming of Parks and Recreation Facilities

The public sometimes suggests that parks and recreation facilities be named after persons, living or dead.

To provide a systematic procedure for the naming of parks and recreation facilities which will assist in their location by the citizenry, and to develop a method for the retention of names of historical or fiscal significance.

As a general policy, parks and recreation facilities should be named to identify their locations. Especially for parks, the name of the community area, the names of nearby geographic features, the names of adjacent schools and street names should be given first consideration. However, they may also be named for individuals, living or dead, who are of historical significance to the local area or who have madé major financial contributions in the opinion of the appropriate Recreation Councils and/or other advisory bodies, Board committees and the full Board. Facilities within parks, (such as buildings; gyms, courts, etc.) are more appropriate for naming after individuals than are parks.

Renaming a facility for a person, when that facility is already named for a person, should only be undertaken with the utmost consideration. Every attempt should be made to contact the person or heirs of the person for whom the facility is currently named, to present their views verbally, or in writing, at a public hearing.

The Recreation Council effected by the proposed name change, shall hold a public hearing to review the request and the supporting documents and information, and shall make recommendations to the Area Committees and the Park and Recreation Board on any and all recommended changes to the renaming of existing facilities.

For the record, the Friends Board of Directors voted many months ago to support the designation of the CVREP trail as the "Marvin Gerst Trail."

On a personal note, I worked with Marvin Gerst over many years through the Los Peñasquitos Canyon Preserve Citizens Advisory Committee. I headed up the Trails Committee in a tumultuous period for the trails issue. Marvin was deeply invested in trails and their use. He had strong opinions which he expressed, but supported reasonable compromises between trail user groups.

But, most importantly, he pioneered the concept of planning community wide trail systems, even using his own property in Carmel Valley as a bargaining chip to encourage adjacent property owners to develop a comprehensive trail plan such as the eventual CVREP system.

Marvin Gerst Day

Presented by District 1 Councilmember Sherri S. Lightner

WHEREAS, Marvin Gerst grew up in the San Fernando Valley and attended Reed College and Stanford University before moving to San Diego during the 1970s; and

WHEREAS, soon after the move to San Diego, Marvin bought his beloved Appaloosa horse, Scout, and enjoyed riding throughout the vast open space that is now Carmel Valley, Torrey Hills, Pacific Highlands Ranch and Del Mar Mesa, from the San Dieguito River Valley to Los Penasquitos and Lopez Canyons, and from Black Mountain to the beach at Torrey Pines; and

WHEREAS, in 1982, he purchased a horse ranch next to Carmel Creek, just south of what is now SR-56; and

WHEREAS, when the development plan for Carmel Valley Neighborhood 8 was being established, Marvin had only one request- that a horse trail traversing all of the properties, from east to west, be included in the plan; and

WHEREAS, that trail is now two trails, known to the community as the Carmel Valley Restoration and Enhancement Project (CVREP) trail, and is travelled daily by a number of people, of all ages, including commuter bicyclists, jogging strollers, dog walkers, horseback riders, runners and those just enjoying a leisurely walk; and

WHEREAS, Marvin has since been a leader in advocating for the preservation and expansion of the trails and played an integral role in organizing the community when the development of newer neighborhoods threatened the future of the trails; and

WHEREAS, from 1986 to 1990, Marvin served on the Citizens Advisory Committee for the then newly established Los Penesquitos Canyon Preserve. He rejoined in 2003 when a rumor circulated that the Preserve was going to exclude horses, and has served as chair of the CAC for the past three years; and

WHEREAS, for nearly ten years, he has served as a property owner representative and recreation advocate on the Del Mar Mesa Community Planning Board, and

WHEREAS, Marvin has also served as an advocate for the preservation of the rural landscapes in the San Dieguito River Valley, and the connection of all of the pieces of the 55 mile long Coast to Crest Trail, as a member of the San Dieguito River Park Citizens Advisory Committee and its Project Review Committee; NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT PROCLAIMED, by the Council of the City of San Diego, that this Council, for and on behalf of the people of San Diego, in appreciation of his exceptional work and service to protecting and enhancing San Diego's trails and open space, does hereby declare May 10, 2012, to be **"MARVIN GERST DAY"** in the City of San Diego.

Marvin S. Gerst, Ph.D. was a familiar sight on Carmel Valley and Del Mar Mesa trails for over twenty-five years, and was known to City staff and decision makers as a project applicant and as an outspoken trails advocate. He died last May after a long struggle with Parkinson's disease, and grateful local citizens would like to name the existing trail often referred to as the "CVREP" trail after him.

The newly named Marvin Gerst Trail would extend from the eastern edge of the Palacio Del Mar neighborhood, at the foot of the slope south of the homes, westward to El Camino Real, and would include both the asphalt lane suitable for bike wheels and strollers and the softer gravel lane intended for pedestrians and horses.

The trail's location was approved as part of the CV Neighborhood 8 Precise Plan in 1984. The land it traverses later became part of the Caltrans Carmel Valley Restoration and Enhancement Project (CVREP), and was improved with the trail as mitigation for the disruptions to Carmel Creek and surrounding open space associated with the construction of SR-56. The trail east of Carmel Country Road is now maintained by the Palacio Del Mar HOA, and the trail west of the road is maintained by the City of San Diego.

Carmel Valley is a 4000-acre master-planned community whose 1975 design did not include any trails through open space, nor any trail connections to the adjacent emerging regional open space parks, Los Penasquitos Canyon Preserve and the San Dieguito River Park. The major developers were very reluctant to provide trails, in part because the City did not have any trail standards. Marvin Gerst was the first property owner/developer to convince his fellow property owners to nevertheless include a three-mile trail in their plans. From that wildly successful starting point trail enthusiasts were able to argue/lobby/petition and demonstrate, on foot, on horse and on bike, to achieve the interconnected public trail system that we all enjoy today.


Over the years, Marvin continued to do his part, serving as the recreation representative on the Del Mar Mesa Community Planning Board, as an early member and later chair of the Los Penasquitos Canyon Preserve Citizens Advisory Committee, and as a property owners' representative and a member of the Project Review Committee for the San Dieguito River Park CAC.

Community members have stepped forward to fund new trail signs, possibly including a granite boulder with a bronze plaque depicting Marvin and his impressive spotted horse, Scout.

Residents hope to establish Marvin Gerst Trail

A n effort is building to name one of Carmel Valley's most popular and well-used trails in memory of Marvin Gerst, an avid defender of San Diego's sensitive open space preserves. Gerst, who passed away on May 11 after a long fight with Parkinson's disease, played an important role in the establishment of the Carmel Valley Restoration and Enhancement Project (CVREP) trail, which is traveled daily by bicyclists, jogging strollers, dog walkers, horseback riders, runners and those just enjoying a leisurely walk.

While the area will always officially carry its "bureaucratic" CVREP name, longtime friend Anne Harvey hopes the "anchor" pathway he helped create can be known as The Marvin Gerst Trail.

Harvey and Lisa Ross of the Friends of Del Mar Mesa, made their initial presentation on their proposal to the Carmel Valley Community Planning Board on June 23. They will have to also get approval from the Ocean Air Recreation Council.

"There was no stronger advocate for trails than Marvin Gerst," Ross said.

After Gerst moved to San Diego in the 1970s, he and his beloved Appaloosa horse Scout enjoyed riding throughout the wide open space that is now Carmel Valley, Torrey Hills, Pacific Highlands Ranch and Del Mar Mesa.

In 1982, Gerst purchased a horse ranch next to Carmel Creek, just south of what is now SR-56.

Harvey met Gerst back in the 1980s at a Sorrento Hills planning meeting (Sorrento Hills is now present-day Torrey Hills), when they both objected to the approved community trails plan being just SDG&E service routes. When the bulldozers came with the giant wave of development, Harvey said Gerst wanted to be involved in the process so that there would always be trails, for equestrians and other users. Harvey said back in those days, trail users weren't taken seriously, dismissed as "birdwatchers and mushroom gatherers," a customer that the new developments didn't think they would likely have. And developers said no one would have horses in the future, Harvey said.

"It all changed when a Building Industry Association study in the early 1990s showed that the number one thing that homeowners were looking for was access to trails and open space," Harvey said.

When the development plan for Carmel Valley Neighborhood 8 was being established, as a property Gerst had only one request — he would not cooperate until he got a trail traversing all of the properties, connecting from the east end to the west end —that trail now known as the CVREP trail.

Carmel Valley Community Planning Board Chair Frisco White said Gerst was a very respected community asset.

He was on the Del Mar Mesa Community Planning Board for over 10 years and served as an advocate for the preservation of the rural landscapes in the San Dieguito River Valley as a member of the San Dieguito River Park Citizens Advisory Committee and its Project Review Committee.

Gerst also served on the Los Penasquitos Canyon Preserve Citizens Advisory Committee and, for several years, was its chair.

"Marvin Gerst was a tireless champion of protecting and preserving all the things that make living here so precious," wrote Pam Slater Price, the former District 3 San Diego County Supervisor on the Friends of Del Mar Mesa Facebook page.
