




1985 – Adoption of the Mission Trails Regional Park Master Development Plan






Reasons for Master Plan Update:

- 1997- Multiple Species Conservation Program Subarea Plan limited development potential of the 1985 MTRP Master Development Plan
- 2. Proposed expansion of park boundaries.
 - 2012 West Sycamore approximately 1,800 acres deeded to the City
 - East Elliot approximately 2,600 acres/City currently owns about 730 acres


















Figure S-2: Entry Monuments








Specific Objectives of the NRMP

- Update sensitive species and habitat mapping
- Develop management guilds (management units based on habitat groupings with similar life-history requirements and/or threats) for groups of species and/or habitats
- Identify and prioritize threats to sensitive species and habitats
- Document current understanding of natural systems and species life history requirements using conceptual models
- Develop conservation and enhancement goals for individual populations/habitats and/or management guilds based on MSCP conditions of coverage (MSCP Plan Table 3-5
