SUBJECT:

Curfew Implementation at Fanuel Street Park, Mission Bay

#### **SUMMARY**

<u>Issue</u> – Should the Park and Recreation Board approve recommending that the San Diego City Council enact a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park located within Mission Bay Park? If approved, the nighttime curfew would make it unlawful for any person to be on the grounds of Fanuel Street Park from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. The San Diego City Council must amend the San Diego Municipal Code (§63.0120) in order to enact the nighttime curfew at these locations.

<u>Director's Recommendation</u> – Staff recommends acceptance of the recommendations from the Pacific Beach Town Council, the Bay Scene HOA, the Pacific Beach Woman's Club and the Mission Bay Park Committee as noted below for the proposed Fanuel Street Park curfew.

#### Other Recommendations

- On December 3, 2019, the Mission Bay Park Committee unanimously approved to support a nighttime curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. at Fanuel Street Park. (Attachment 1)
- The Pacific Beach Woman's Club supported a nighttime curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. at Fanuel Street Park in the form of a letter dated July 16, 2019. (Attachment 2)
- On June 12, 2019, the Bay Scene HOA unanimously supported the Fanuel Street Park nighttime curfew. (Attachment 3).
- On April 3, 2019, the Pacific Beach Town Council voted to approve a nighttime curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. at Fanuel Street Park. (Attachment 4)

#### <u>Fiscal Impact</u> – None.

<u>Water and Energy Conservation Status</u> – The proposed action would not have an impact on any water and energy conservation guidelines contained in Council Policy 200-14.

<u>Environmental</u> – The Planning Department has determined that this activity is not subject to CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15060(c)(2), as it would not result in any direct or indirect physical change in the environment. California Coastal Commission will need to approve.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Residents of the communities of Pacific Beach approached Department staff to enact a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park. The Pacific Beach Town Council acted to recommend a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park with support from the Pacific Beach Women's Club and Beach Scene HOA. The Mission Bay Park Committee acted to approve the proposed curfew at their December 3, 2019 meeting.

General Development Plan (GDP), which outlines uses for this park is provided in Attachment 5.

#### DISCUSSION

The reasons residents requested to impose a curfew at this park include illegal activities such as, gang activity, drug dealing, vandalism, and other activity as well as a loss of feeling safe while using the parks. Crime mapping statistics show a significant level if illegal activity in the areas surrounding this park. (Attachment 6)

Only park locations listed in San Diego Municipal Code §63.0120 are subject to a nighttime curfew. Currently, the curfew applies to the following parks: Children's Park, Gaslamp Square Park, Pantoja Park, the Children's Museum Park, Fault Line Park, Cortez Hill Park, Spruce Street Pedestrian Bridge, University Heights Open Space Park, North Park Community Park, Montclair Neighborhood Park, Cedar Ridge Mini Park, North Park Mini Park, and City Heights Square Mini Park. This proposal would add one additional site to this list. Park property that is not specifically designated in the Municipal Code is not subjected to a nighttime curfew.

The curfew provides a means for the San Diego Police Department to remove patrons from this park in the late hours to minimize illegal use at this park.

The Pacific Beach Town Council, Bay Scene HOA, Pacific Beach Woman's Club and the Mission Bay Park Committee voted to recommend a nighttime curfew from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. at Fanuel Street Park. The Park and Recreation Board is the next advisory group to consider this matter; if approved, the Department will bring the matter forward to the City Council for consideration. The application of a nighttime curfew is governed by the San Diego Municipal Code in Chapter 6: \$63.0120 Public Works and Property, Public Improvement and Assessment Proceedings (Attachment 7). In addition, the Fanuel Street park curfew will need to be approved by the California Coastal Commission.

#### **ALTERNATIVES**

- 1. Do not approve a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- 2. Approve a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park from 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m.
- 3. Consider an alternate nighttime curfew with different hours of park closure.

## **CHAIRPERSONS REPORT** - No Report

# **CITY COUNCIL DISTRICT 2 OFFICE**

Carrie Munson reported that SDPD has the largest recruiting class in 25 years which can be contributed to better pay and marketing; San Diego Community Power will help the region move to a clean energy future to meet climate action plans; new trees were planted at Kate Sessions Park; Community Workshops on Homelessness will be held 12/4/19 @ Crown Point Junior Music Academy; State of the District will be held 1/30/20 at 5:30 pm @ Liberty Station, community awards will be presented; Boards and Commissions will be making some changes to the Advisory Boards; Point in Time Court will be held 1/23/20, CD2 will participate again this year; SD Humane Society contract has been renewed.

#### **STAFF REPORTS**

## Parks and Recreation Mission Bay Park

**Jeff Van Deerlin, Program Manager,** reported that Dusty Rhodes lighting is in the works.

De Anza Mobile Home Update - On June 24, 2019, SD City Council approved the lease with Northwest MB, LLC to operate the Mission Bay RV Resort and make improvements to the former De Anza Mobile Home Park. The previous company managing the property, Newport Pacific, gave the City a 30-day notice in May 2019 that they were terminating their agreement. The new lessee, which shares its management team with Campland-on-the-Bay, is moving forward with its planned cleanup at De Anza. This includes roadway and building improvements as well as the removal of the remaining mobile homes on the site. Potential litigation with San Diego Audubon, however, resulted in a 2-month delay and extended the start of the De Anza cleanup to March 7, 2020. In a settlement reached with Audubon, Northeast is required to confine its planned, new 150 campsites, which will repurpose existing mobile home sites and utilities, to the northeastern corner of the De Anza property. Presently, Northeast is pursuing a Coastal Development Permit for the cleanup and is moving forward with preliminary steps to remove the 166 mobile homes that remain on the property. This includes conducting asbestos and lead testing on all the homes and determining the scope of work for the abatement portion of the project. As to the lease, the initial term is four years. A fifth year is triggered if Northeast completes capital improvements within 24 months, subject to extension for unavoidable delay. The City then has three one-year options to further extend the lease.

Mission Bay Athletic Field comfort station and concession stand update: The estimated project cost is approximately \$1.8 million. We have about \$1.2 million in the current budget, so we will be asking the Committee to approve allocating the balance of \$600,000. We anticipate design completion by September 2020. Construction should begin by December 2020 and the facility should be in service by May 2021. We are currently in the consultant procurement phase. The project charter was based on the assumption that as-needed consultant procurement method would be utilized. During the procurement process it was determined there was no longer capacity available in the as-needed contract and an alternate procurement method (sole source contract) was pursued. We are updating the design to meet current code, as well as a few scope items that were added by the ADA folks during the preliminary engineering phase.

Mike Rodrigues, District Manager, reported that the West Bonita Cove improvement project (Maruta Gardner Playground) is underway and scheduled for completion on May 22, 2020 with a 90-day maintenance period to follow. Mike provided other park project updates: Crown Point playground is at 30% design; Tecolote North & South improvements are at initial design; Santa Clara playground and comfort station is at 60% design; Crown Point walkways went out to bid in October and the Bonita Cove East is in pre-design. We are in the process of filling the Park Ranger vacancy and park maintenance staff is busy with off season projects.

Rory Ginsberg provided a two-phase proposal to allow slacklining at Mission Bay Park. Phase 1) Designating seven trees in Bonita Cove as slackline permitted area over the sand not to interfere with the volleyball courts; Phase 2) Creation of a slackline specific park on the sand at Mariner's Cove through a Right of Entry Permit with private funding and volunteer labor.

Judith Munoz asked about temporary lines and if the lines are provided.

Kari Logan had concerns about impacts to the Bonita Cove volleyball court usage and safety.

Stephanie Smith asked if they considered creation of a slackline area near existing or planned adult fitness courses within the park.

Jeff Johnson shared his concerns of a permanent slackline park at the very popular Mariners Point area which is in high demand for park permits.

## MOTION: MOVED/SECONDED

A motion was made by S. Smith and seconded by J. Munoz for the slackline proponents to work with city staff to consider finding a suitable location near an existing or planned adult fitness area to incorporate a slackline park, not using any trees and keeping consistent with park design. The motion carried 6-1 (Johnson).

202: Curfew Implementation at Fanuel Street Park – The Pacific Beach Town Council is seeking a vote of recommendation from the Mission Bay Park Committee for the implementation of a nighttime curfew of 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. at Fanuel Street Park.

Brian White, President, Pacific Beach Town Council requested support from the Mission Bay Park Committee to implement a 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. curfew at Fanuel Street Park citing rampant illegal activity being observed by area residents. A nighttime curfew was supported by the Pacific Beach Town Council as well as the Bay Scene HOA and Pacific Beach Woman's Club. Crime data statistics for the park were provided. Over 500 signatures were gathered in support of the proposed curfew.

Many residents from the community spoke in support of implementing a nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park primarily based on health and

safety concerns. No one spoke in opposition.

## MOTION: MOVED/SECONDED

A motion was made by J. Munoz and seconded by J. Johnson to support a 10:00 p.m. to 5:00 a.m. nighttime curfew at Fanuel Street Park. The motion carried unanimously 7-0.

The next step will Park and Recreation Board for consideration, then full San Diego City Council for approval to amend SD Municipal Code as it relates to nighttime curfews for public parks. California Coastal Commission approval will also be required before the proposed curfew goes into effect.

Christopher Ramirez with the Arthritis Foundation presented a proposal for a new fundraiser walk and festival to be held at Crown Point Shores with minimal impacts to the park.

A motion was made by G. Ingolia and seconded by S. Smith to approve the staff recommendation and approve the event as presented. The motion carried 7–0.

501. Shoreline Café update – Bradley and Kristine Schnell provided an update on construction of the new Shoreline Café at the old Mission Bay Park Information Center building. They are very close to completing the restoration of the interior and anticipate opening for business with a

limited menu in January 2020 with full food café with bike rentals open in Summer 2020.

502. Redevelopment of Hilton San Diego Resort and Spa located in Mission Bay Park.

Pierre Saladin with READ introduced George Allen representing Pebblebrook Hotel Trust. Mr. Allen reported that the Hilton San Diego Mission Bay Resort will be rebranded as the new luxury-focused San Diego Mission Bay Resort managed by Noble House Hotels and Resorts effective January 1, 2020. The resort underwent \$21 million in renovations in 2019 with another \$10.5 million to begin in early 2020. The transformation of the San Diego Mission Bay Resort will have a positive and long-lasting impact on not only travelers to Mission Bay Park, but also employees, community members and the environment.

Dear Chairperson Robinson,

The Pacific Beach Woman's Club has learned that curfews were approved in March for various parks in downtown San Diego because of illegal activities.

Today our Board of Directors voted (with one abstention) to support the Pacific Beach Town Council's initiative to establish curfews in three of our parks in Pacific Beach: Fanuel Street Park (10 pm - 5 am), PB Library Park (10 pm - 5 am), and PB Community Park at PB Recreation Center (11 pm - 6 am).

Many of our club members, friends, and relatives live near at least one of these parks and have noted many illegal and unsafe activities in them. Stolen bikes are disassembled and sold there; illegal drugs are used and sold; there are graffiti and other vandalism of public and private property. Some of the people who engage in these activities have threatened passersby.

Our understanding is that the curfews are not targeted toward homeless people who use the parks, but rather toward criminals. We agree with this use of the curfews.

Our law enforcement officers need a mechanism to discourage or prevent criminal activities and to keep our citizens safe. We believe these curfews will serve that purpose.

Dear Mr. Robinson:

Due to rampant illegal activity being observed by residents, the Pacific Beach community is seeking a curfew of 10:00 p.m. - 5:00 a.m. for Fanuel Street Park, located at 4000 Fanuel St. This park, commonly called "Felony" Park by local residents, is a hot spot for criminal activity including open drug dealing, intravenous drug usage, and chop shops for stolen bike disassembly. Needles have been found near the bathrooms and in the grass where children play. The current situation is an eminent public health and safety risk, not only for park-goers, but to the surrounding residents.

At our meeting on April 3rd, 2019, the PB Town Council board of directors voted unanimously to pursue a curfew for Fanuel Park. You will find this vote under Action Item 6-E of our PBTC board minutes attachment. A park curfew petition was subsequently circulated to local residents, and has gathered over 500 signatures to date.

As the advisory group with direct jurisdiction over Fanuel Park, we hope the Mission Bay Park Committee will vote for recommendation of this curfew, and that Fanuel Park can ultimately be added to San Diego Municipal Code Section 63.0120 Nighttime Curfew for Certain Public Parks. We believe a curfew at this park would be an added enforcement tool for our SDPD Northern Division officers to keep Fanuel Park and the surrounding area safer for all.

# §63.0120 Nighttime Curfew for Certain Public Parks and the Spruce Street Pedestrian Bridge

- (a) It is unlawful for any person to be on the grounds of the following parks from midnight until 6:00 a.m.: Children's Park, Gaslamp Square Park, Pantoja Park, the Children's Museum Park, Fault Line Park, Cortez Hill Park, North Park Community Park, Montclair Neighborhood Park, Cedar Ridge Mini Park, and North Park Mini Park.
- (b) It is unlawful for any person to be on the Spruce Street Pedestrian Bridge from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m.
- (c) It is unlawful for any person to be on the portions of the University Heights Open Space Park depicted in map 63.0120-A from 10:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. between April 1 and October 31 and from 8:00 p.m. until 6:00 a.m. between November 1 and March 31.
- (d) It is unlawful for any person to be on the grounds of the City Heights Square Mini Park from 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m.
