




Dominant plants in Coastal Salt Marshes are Glasswort (Salicornia), Alkali heath (Frankenia), Salt grass and Cordgrass.








De Anza Study Area

California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)

- Inform public and decision makers of potential significant environmental effects
- Encourage public involvement

California Environmental Quality Act Statute & Guidelines




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Environmental Impact Report (EIR) Purpose

- Disclose the project's potential significant effects on the physical environment
- Identify mitigation measures to avoid or reduce environmental impacts
- Analyze a reasonable range of alternatives
- Foster public review/participation
