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<u>Fiscal Impact</u> – None

<u>Water and Energy Conservation Status</u> – The proposed action will comply with all water and energy conservation guidelines contained in Council Policy 200–14.

<u>ENVIRONMENTAL –</u> (Attachment G)

The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines. This activity is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 (Existing Facilities), 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures), 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land), 15311 (Accessory Structures), and 15323 (Normal Operations of Facilities for Public Gatherings).

BACKGROUND

The current General Development Plan (GDP) for the Linda Vista Community Park indicates a baseball backstop and bleachers in the south west corner of the park. Due to sloping grades and lack of adequate space, the baseball field was never constructed in this area. Currently this portion of the park is not utilized for recreation or programming.

The proposed action is to change the designated use of this area on the existing GDP from a baseball field to a community garden.

DISCUSSION

The proposed amendment to the General Development Plan for the Linda Vista Community Park is to establish the Linda Vista Community Garden (LVCG). Through a Right of Entry (ROE) permit that is issued by the Parks and Recreation Department, the Bayside Community Center (BCC) will design and construct the community garden in the southwest corner of the Linda Vista Community Park. The operations and maintenance of the Community Garden will be the responsibility of Bayside Community Center (BCC) through a Special Use Permit (SUP).

BCC's goals are to address food insecurity, provide a safe space for diverse cultures to spend recreational time together, offer urban garden educational programming and create natural environments for all residents to enjoy.

The proposed (approximately .3 acres) garden will include a variety of elements and programs to address the needs of the community.

- Garden Elements:
 - planter beds, compost and vermiculture bins, potting tables, a prefabricated greenhouse, lockable storage sheds
 - \circ $\,$ seating for programming, respite, and social interaction $\,$
 - picnic tables, shade structures, benches
 - o plants such as: fruit trees, native pollinator plants
 - $_{\odot}$ $\,$ Surface materials such as: decomposed granite, mulch
 - Signage: Interpretive, Directional, informational
- Water Access:
 - proposed project will also require an extension of the irrigation mainline to the garden with hose bibs provided at each garden plot

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- Parks and Recreation staff to implement a sub metering arrangement with the operator fully responsible for the utilities
- Accessibility (ADA):
 - new accessible parking stall and accessible walkway from the parking lot to the garden location
 - o accessible raised garden beds and site furnishings
- Security and Safety
 - With proximity to the various ballfields, additional measures were considered to ensure the protection of the participants in the garden.
 - The garden will be secured with additional measures including:
 - lockable vehicular and pedestrian access gates
 - solar motion lights
 - addition of 8' tall perimeter fencing where needed

The amending of the Linda Vista Community Park GDP to include a community garden will repurpose and revitalize the southwest corner of the park where illegal dumping has been a concern for park staff. With the new development adjacent to the proposed garden location, activation of this space will help to support a safe, accessible, and vibrant neighborhood.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO APPEAL ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION

PLANNING DEPARTMENT

PROJECT NAME: Linda Vista Community Garden

COMMUNITY PLAN AREA: Linda Vista

COUNCIL DISTRICT: District 7

LOCATION: Linda Vista Community Park, 7064 Levant St, San Diego, CA 92111

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: The proposed project involves an amendment to the General Development Plan for the Linda Vista Community Park to establish the Linda Vista Community Garden. The Bayside Community Center will design, construct, and operate a community garden growing space in the southwest corner of the Linda Vista Community Park. The proposed community garden growing space will include decomposed granite, mulch, garden and planter beds, compost and vermiculture bins, a native pollinator garden, potting tables, a pre-fabricated greenhouse, picnic tables and shade structures, benches, tree stump seats, storage sheds, fruit trees, signs, gateways (a vehicular access gate and a pedestrian access gate), hose bibs, and other recreational amenities. A chain link fence will be installed around the community garden site and an accessible parking stall is proposed adjacent to the site. The proposed project will also require an extension of the irrigation mainline to the garden. The goals of this project are to address food insecurity, provide a safe space for the diverse cultures to spend recreational time together, offer urban garden educational programming and create natural environments for all residents to enjoy.

ENTITY CONSIDERING PROJECT APPROVAL: City of San Diego

ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: This activity is categorically exempt from CEQA pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Sections 15301 (Existing Facilities), 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures), 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land), 15311 (Accessory Structures), and 15323 (Normal Operations of Facilities for Public Gatherings).

ENTITY MAKING ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION: City of San Diego Mayor-Appointed Designee.

STATEMENT SUPPORTING REASON FOR ENVIRONMENTAL DETERMINATION:

The City of San Diego conducted an environmental review that determined the project would not have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment pursuant to State CEQA Guidelines Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) which consists of the operation, repair, maintenance, permitting, leasing, licensing, or minor alteration of existing public or private structures, facilities, mechanical

equipment, or topographical features, involving negligible or no expansion of existing or former use; and Section 15303 (New Construction or Conversion of Small Structures) which consists of construction and location of limited numbers of new, small facilities or structures; installation of small new equipment and facilities in small structures; and the conversion of existing small structures from one use to another where only minor modifications are made in the exterior of the structure; and Section 15304 (Minor Alterations to Land) which consists of minor public or private alterations in the condition of land, water, and/or vegetation which do not involve removal of healthy, mature, scenic trees except for forestry or agricultural purposes; and Section 15311 (Accessory Structures) which consists of construction, or placement of minor structures accessory to (appurtenant to) existing commercial, industrial, or institutional facilities; and Section 15323 (Normal Operations of Facilities for Public Gatherings) which consists of the normal operations of existing facilities for public gatherings for which the facilities were designed, where there is a past history of the facility being used for the same or similar kind of purpose. For the purposes of this section, "past history" shall mean that the same or similar kind of activity has been occurring for at least three years and that there is a reasonable expectation that the future occurrence of the activity would not represent a change in the operation of the facility. The exceptions listed in CEQA Guidelines Section 15300.2 would not apply in that no cumulative impacts were identified; no significant effects on the environment were identified; the project is not adjacent to a scenic highway; no historical resources would be affected by the action; and the project was not identified on a list of hazardous waste sites pursuant to Section 65962.5 of the Government Code.

Dear Sirs,

My family moved into Linda Vista in 1954 after buying a new home in Mission Heights on my mother's G.I. Bill benefits post World War II. I have lived in this community from then until now except for some time to attend college and find employment post-graduation. When my parents moved from Linda Vista my husband and I moved into the house she bought. One of my children was Special Needs and I spent my time and energy working with him and advocating through the Community Advising Committee for Special Education in the San Diego Unified School District. I have attended all the schools in the neighborhood from Kit Carson Elementary to Montgomery Junior High to Kearny High School and the new San Diego Mesa College. I graduated from San Diego State College. I feel that I know the neighborhood needs from both a child's and an adult's perspective.

When I attended school in the neighborhood there were children of three ethnicities: white, black, and Hispanic. Most of the children came from a military background. Now the community has numerous ethnicities with different incomes, customs, languages, and dreams for themselves. Bayside has helped all these ethnicities to integrate into the community by having after school programs for children to catch up to grade level in school by learning English. Parents have joined groups to learn how to advocate for their needs and the needs of their children. The elderly has lunch together at the Center and socialize. And the first garden for the community was established out in front of the Bayside Community Center.

I remember the first garden. Years later I passed by the spot where Bayside was and the building and the garden were gone. It seems like a very long time later I was told that the garden was now at a parking lot and a front yard of a home. I expressed my surprise and was told that the lot that Bayside and the garden was on was sold and people still needed the food that came from it, so they improvised a food program.

After I retired and my son settled into a group home, I decided that my time would be well served to be used for the community I grew up in. I started out attending the Linda Vista Town Council. Then became the secretary for the Linda Vista Town Council Board. I was getting acquainted with all the problems in the community that I never had the time to notice before. Some members of the community were always willing to help and advocate for improvement. Poverty and hunger were still problems but now we also had gang violence and homelessness. I needed some guidance about how to approach being a Board member of a community council.

The University of San Diego offered a course in the School of Leadership and Education Sciences in how to be a Board Member of a Non-profit. I received my Board Member Certification Program certificate in 2019. Then Bayside offered a course sponsored by the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency called Leaders in Action which educated us about all the influences that contribute or are demeritorious to a community. That really opened my eyes to the everyday effects on a community. To graduate we had to pick a project to work on for the betterment of our community; large or small,

taking a long time or not so long, to learn the steps needed to achieve an improvement in some aspect of the neighborhood. I chose food. I received my Resident Leadership Academy certificate of completion in the Spring of 2020.

At the same time members of Bayside were gathering steam to try to get a permanent, productive, and central place on a piece of ground for a Community Garden. I came on board and so did several other community members under the tutelage of Amy Zink, Bayside Environment Learning Center Program Manager. We call ourselves the Linda Vista Grows Steering Committee. We have presented a plan to the Linda Vista Park and Recreation Board, and they have accepted our plan. We now ask that the City of San Diego Park and Recreation Board vote to amend the Linda Vista Community Park's General Development Plan to include the Linda Vista Community Garden. We appreciate your consideration to amend the General Development Plan and we thank you for your time.
