


The Climate Action Plan

The City of San Diego Climate Action Plan (CAP) is a legally binding document adopted in December 2015, committing the City to reducing greenhouse gas emissions (GHG) to 50% of 2010 levels by 2035. As of 2020, we are on track to reaching this goal, with GHG levels down 25%, while also increasing job growth in every CAP strategy.



Our Climate, Our Future - The Update

Climate Equity: addressing historical inequities suffered by people of color, allowing everyone to fairly share the same benefits and burdens from climate solutions and attain full and equal access to opportunities regardless of one's background and identity.


Our Climate, Our Future is the update to the 2015 Climate Action Plan, with the following goals:

- 1. Set more ambitious greenhouse gas reduction goals over a longer time horizon
- 2. Center climate equity
- 3. Quantify and connect the co-benefits of climate actions, such as improved air quality, safe routes for walking and bicycling, workforce development and quality jobs, and improved natural spaces.

Outreach & Engagement

- Targeted engagement efforts in communities of concern, in partnership with <u>Casa Familiar</u>, <u>Climate Action Campaign</u>, <u>Environmental Health Coalition</u>, <u>Mid-City CAN</u>, <u>San Diego Urban</u> <u>Sustainability Coalition</u>, the <u>Greenlining Institute</u>, and the <u>Institute for Local Government</u>
- Bilingual digital survey 1,800 responses
- Our Climate, Our Future bilingual newsletter 1,200 subscribers
- Ten public forums, including one in each council district 500 participants
- Partnership with library for youth activity book 10,000 copies distributed in English and Spanish
- Presentations and one-on-one meetings with community groups and residents
