F. INFORMATION ITEMS

Field 7 & 8 naming proposal. – Steve Leffler

Proposal to rename fields 7 and 8 at Canyonside to be named after Steve Mauch due to his 20 years of service to the community. It's an information item, so it won't be voted on until a future meeting.

G. ACTION ITEMS

- 1) Canyonside Community Park Tennis Club Expansion Conceptual Plan – New tennis and multi-use courts, clubhouse with bathroom, and office. – Steve Leffler
 - RPTC has nearly 300 people on a 2+ year wait list for the 12-tennis court facility. Additional tennis courts are needed and there is a strong demand from players for a small clubhouse with a bathroom facility, an instructor office and new, multipurpose court space.
 - Canyonside will receive \$2,553,857 for the expansion of the Tennis Center. Grant work must be done by March 1st, 2026.
 - The conceptual plan includes 2 new tennis courts west to the existing upper courts, 1 new court in unused area east of upper courts, relocate/improve batting cages, 2 multiuse courts west and south of lower courts, and a tennis clubhouse and instruction office with restrooms.
 - Pictures of the new locations of the proposed changes were shown in a packet. The batting cages are planned to be relocated to existing horseshoe area by field 2 and 2 Cricket cages will be built next to fields 4 and 5. One softball cage will remain next to the baseball cages at the new location and share a common wall and electricity. The cages are planned to increase in size to mitigate safety concerns.
 - Brian R. moves to approve the conceptual proposal, Glenn seconds, the motion is approved.
