F. ACTION ITEMS

1) Request Renaming Canyonside Field 8 - PGGSA Board Member Kevin Krogstad introduces himself, he's been with PQ Softball since 2013, Treasurer since 2019. Steve Mauch has been involved with the league for over 20 years. When COVID almost lead to the league being shut down, Mauch stepped back in as President, he stabilized the league. They now have 175 players. They are in financially good shape. Due to his achievements and public service there is a proposal to name field 8 at Canyonside after him in his honor.

Dianne confirms that field 8 isn't already named after someone.

A passed vote would go onto the P&R Board to decide what to do next.

Theresa seconds the motion for a vote. The motion passes 4-0-0.

G. INFORMATION ITEMS

1) RPTC Conceptual Plan: batting cages – Aaron McDaniel (RPLL), Sanjit Menezes (Cricket) and Steve Mauch (PQSGA) Plan to move the batting cages by field 2 and 5. They would build new batting cages first, then remove the old ones.

2) Potential GDP Amendment for BMR – Brian Reschke, Steve Leffler. For Black Mountain Ranch, they have a goal of updating the park plans to the current demands within the community.

- 1. Change Football out with Cricket (this would require moving the dog park to another site).
- 2. Use the pool area for 2 outside Basketball courts.
- 3. Use the proposed 4 Basketball courts for Pickleball with up to 16 courts.
- 4. Soccer and Cricket would like to have artificial turf installed. There are sponsors for the first installation. Turf would reduce water and labor costs. Plexiglass wall would allow for sponsors to provide field revenue for turf replacement every 8–10 years.
- 5. The use of a Cricket field would be a great improvement in park use for minority communities in San Diego.
- 6. Pickleball is growing in popularity. The senior community would be greatly served by this feature.

Penasquitos Village Neighborhood Park

- 1. Initiate feasibility and park updates.
- 2. A new plan to reduce grading by 80%, should reduce the expense for this park by 80% as well.
- 3. Create entrance and parking lot only.
- 4. Create a mountain bike park and maybe a disc golf location.
- 5. Room for a dog park as well.
- 6. The first park in the region to have a bus route stop.
